Studies In Romans

(Romans 12:10-15)

1. How should Christians treat one another?

"Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another" (Romans 12:10).

- Kind to each other (Ephesians 4:32, Colossians 3:12, and II Peter 1:3-10).
- Affectioned [mutual love, loving affection) to each other (II Corinthians 7:14-15).
- Brotherly love (John 13:34-35, Hebrews 13:1, I Peter 1:22, I Peter 2:17, I Peter 3:8, and I John 3:14-18).
- Giving preference to each others (Matthew 20:26-27, Galatians 5:13, and Philippians 2:3).
- Love ties into these things (I Corinthians 13:4-7).
- 2. Should Christians be lazy people?

No: "Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord" (Romans 12:11).

- Not slothful in business [Strong's # 4710; "speed, eagerness, diligence"] (Proverbs 6:6-11, Proverbs 13:4, Proverbs 18:9, Proverbs 22:29, Proverbs 24:30-34, and II Thessalonians 3:6-15).
- Fervent in spirit (Colossians 4:12-13 and I Peter 4:8), but with caution (Acts 18:24-28 and Romans 10:1-3).
- Serve God (Matthew 4:10, Romans 6:22, and Hebrews 12:28-29).
- 3. Should a Christian be able to rejoice in hope and continue in prayer through times of tribulation?

Yes: "Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer" (Romans 12:12).

- We should be able to rejoice in difficult times because of hope (Romans 5:1-4).
- Our hope should bring joy (Proverbs 10:28, II Thessalonians 2:16, and Hebrews 3:6).
- We have to endure tribulation (Mark 13:13, II Timothy 3:10-12, and James 5:10-11).
- Continuing instant in prayer (Luke 18:1, Acts 2:42, Philippians 4:6-7, Colossians 4:2, and I Thessalonians 5:17-18).

4. Should Christians be willing to socialize with each other and help those Christians who may have financial struggles?

Yes: "Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality" (Romans 12:13).

- Helping truly needy brethren individually (Acts 4:34-37, Acts 11:27-30, Acts 20:34-35, Ephesians 4:28, and I John 3:17) and collectively (Romans 15:25-27, I Corinthians 16:1-4, and II Corinthians 8:1-9:14).
- Understanding there is a time for the church to act and there is a time for the individual Christian to act (I Timothy 5:3-16).
- Given to hospitality (Acts 16:13-15, Hebrews 13:2, and I Peter 4:9).
- Each Scripture about or even close to about social action, never involves the local church collectively. It is not a work of the local church as a collective body, to feed or entertain one another (cf. Romans 14:17 and I Corinthians 11:16-34).
- 5. What action should we take against those who persecute us?

 No action against them, but rather for them: "Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not" (Romans 12:14).
 - Psalms 35:11-13, Matthew 5:43-48, Luke 6:28, Acts 7:51-60, and I Peter 2:21-23.
- 6. Should we be able to relate to one another in triumphs and sufferings? Yes: "Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep" (Romans 12:15).
 - We should feel what our brethren feel (Nehemiah 1:3-11, John 11:33-35, I Corinthians 12:25-27, Philippians 2:17-18, and Philippians 2:25-30).
