## I Peter 2:4-5

Coming To The Rejected Christ To Be His Spiritual House

## I. Introduction:

A. The thought of the text goes from the gracious Lord that we know through His word (**I Peter 2:2-3**), to His being rejected of men.

1. Reason suggests that a person who is good would normally not be harmed (**Proverbs 16:7** and **Romans 13:3**).

2. However, things change when there is a righteous messenger among the wicked (**Proverbs 15:12** and **Amos 5:10**) as was the case with Jesus (**John 3:19-21** and **John 7:7**).

B. From the words of the prophet Isaiah, it was foreknown that Christ would not win a popularity contest (Isaiah 53:1-12; cf. Acts 8:30-35).

1. Jesus was aware of what was happening and going to happen (Mark 3:1-7, Luke 9:22, and John 2:23-25).

2. Jesus went through a lot of rejection while teaching, yet what stands out to most is how horrific He was treated leading up to His death (Matthew 26:55-56, Matthew 26:67-75, Matthew 27:39-44, and Luke 23:18-25).

II. Body: "To whom coming, as unto a living stone, disallowed indeed of men, but chosen of God, and precious, Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ" (I Peter 2:4-5).

A. Come to Jesus (Matthew 11:27-30 and Revelation 22:17).

1. With an understanding that coming to Jesus includes walking away from other things (Matthew 16:24-27, Luke 9:57-62, and Luke 14:25-33).

2. Coming to Jesus requires we learn of Him (John 6:44-45).

3. Jesus is the chief corner stone (Ephesians 2:19-22).

B. It was prophesied that Jesus was going to be the rejected stone (**Psalms 118:22-23**; cf. **Mark 12:1-12**).

1. Jesus, as the light of the world (**John 8:12**), came to His own people and was not received (**John 1:11**).

2. He came, in part, to save Israel from their sins (Acts 3:25-26; 5:30-31).

a. He sent the Apostles to the Jews first (Luke 24:47 and Romans 1:16-17).

b. When the Jews rejected the Gospel attention in teaching then turned to the Gentiles (Acts 13:44-46, Acts 18:1-6, and Acts 28:17-28).

c. This relates to this letter we are studying (I Peter 2:9-10).

C. Unto us, Jesus the rejected stone, is the life giving stone (John 5:26-29).

1. That is, if we will choose to be His sheep (John 10:27-28).

2. Eternal life is in Jesus (I John 5:11; 5:13; 5:20).

D. Jesus is the precious, chosen one of God (**Isaiah 42:1-9**; cf. **Matthew 12:15-21**).

1. Think about the language the Father used regarding Jesus (Matthew 3:13-17 and Matthew 17:1-5).

2. How the Father heard His only begotten Son (John 12:27-30).

3. How the Father did not abandon His only begotten Son (**John 8:27-29** and **John 16:32**).

4. Like Jesus, whether or not we are accepted by men doesn't matter. We need to focus on how God looks at the saints (**Romans 1:7** and **Ephesians 1:6-7**).

E. Ye also...

1. As lively stones (II Corinthians 6:16).

2. A spiritual house (Hebrews 3:1-6).

3. An holy priesthood (**Revelation 1:5-6**).

4. Offering spiritual sacrifices (**Romans 12:1-3**, **Philippians 4:10-18**, and **Hebrews 13:15-16**).

F. Acceptable to God by Jesus Christ (Romans 5:11).

1. We can come before the Father because of Jesus (**Colossians 3:16-17** and **Hebrews 10:19-22**).

2. Our good works glorify God through Christ (I Peter 4:11).

III. Conclusion: Our Next Study: "Wherefore also it is contained in the scripture, Behold, I lay in Sion a chief corner stone, elect, precious: and he that believeth on him shall not be confounded. Unto you therefore which believe he is precious: but unto them which be disobedient, the stone which the builders disallowed, the same is made the head of the corner, And a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offence, even to them which stumble at the word, being disobedient: whereunto also they were appointed" (I Peter 2:6-8).
