An Honorable, Sanctified Vessel

- I. Introduction: Are you profitable for the Master's use?
 - A. We have a foundation of God (**Ephesians 2:20-22**).
 - 1. We are His building, built upon Jesus Christ (I Corinthians 3:1-11).
 - 2. Therefore, our faith resides upon an unshakeable foundation (**Luke 6:46-49**). So, the foundation is not the problem.
 - B. Paul and Timothy spoke of themselves being earthen vessels used to transport the Gospel (**Il Corinthians 4:1-7**).
 - 1. Whether we look at ourselves in the imagery of a building or some other sort of vessel, we [Christians] belong to God and are expected to glorify Him (I Corinthians 6:20).
 - 2. In being converted to Him, we <u>chose</u> to yield [to give ourselves] to be instruments of righteousness (**Romans 6:3-19**).
- II. Body: Being An Honorable, Sanctified Vessel (II Timothy 2:19-21).
 - A. First, being His house is conditional (**Hebrews 3:1-6**).
 - 1. We are not His people just because we initially obeyed (John 8:31-32).
 - 2. Choosing to depart from evil is choosing to do good (**Psalms 34:14** and **Psalms 37:27**).
 - 3. We must continue in the faith (**Colossians 1:23**) not returning to our former sins (**Ephesians 4:17-22**).
 - B. In His great House (Matthew 16:18 and I Timothy 3:15)...
 - 1. ... We must be vessels to honor (I Thessalonians 4:1-6).
 - 2. Through patient continuance in well-doing (Romans 2:7-10).
 - 3. Not to dishonor (i.e. Romans 2:23).
 - C. Think about what it is <u>to be sanctified</u> [to make holy, that is, (ceremonially) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate: hallow, be holy, sanctify (Strong's # 37] (I Corinthians 1:2).
 - 1. Through the truth (John 17:17).
 - 2. By faith (Acts 26:18).
 - 3. In Christ (I Corinthians 1:30).
 - 4. After being washed (I Corinthians 6:9-11; cf. Acts 22:16 and Ephesians 5:25-26).
 - 5. One with He who has sanctified us (**Hebrews 2:11**).
 - 6. Having an inheritance because we're sanctified (Acts 20:32).
 - 7. Up to you to continue in (**Romans 6:22**). *Note: "holiness" in the KJV in the previous reference is from the Greek word "ἀγιασμός" often translated "sanctification"; defined as: "purification, that is, (the state) purity; concretely (by Hebraism) a purifier: holiness, sanctification" (Strong's # 38).

- D. As sanctified [made holy; pure] people; we are to follow righteousness, faith, charity, and peace (**Hebrews 12:14**).
 - 1. We have been called, by the Gospel (II Thessalonians 2:14), unto holiness (I Thessalonians 4:7).
 - 2. We understand that our walk is a walk of faith (II Corinthians 5:7).
 - 3. Not taking our salvation to come for granted (**Ezekiel 33:12-13** and **I Peter 4:17-19**).
- III. Conclusion: Are you meet [profitable; i.e. **II Timothy 4:11**] for the Master's use (**Ephesians 2:8-10** and **Titus 3:14**)?
