## **Boldness In The Day Of Judgment**

## I. Introduction:

- A. Jesus told His twelve not to be of a doubtful mind (Luke 12:29).
  - 1. Being double-minded [wavering] will cause us to be unstable (**James** 1:8).
  - 2. Double-mindedness cannot be ignored (James 4:6-10).
- B. Faith is supposed to move us (**Hebrews 11:7**).
  - 1. Faith is not inactive, for faith "worketh" ["to be active, efficient... to be operative, be at work, put forth power..."; Strong's #1754] by love (**Galatians 5:6**).
  - 2. These doubtful thoughts that cripple Christians are not from God (**Isaiah 26:3**).
  - 3. When doubts arise, Jesus questions "why?" (Luke 24:33-38).
  - 4. Put off every weight that holds you back (**Hebrews 12:1-3**) even if that weight is your own thinking (**John 14:1** and **II Thessalonians 2:1-2**).
- II. Body: What Can We Learn From What Was Written To First Century Saints About Being Bold In The Day Of Judgment (I John 4:14-5:3).
  - A. Confidence at His coming (I John 2:28-29).
    - 1. We can be always confident (II Corinthians 5:1-7).
    - 2. God wants us to be fully persuaded (Romans 4:13-21).
    - 3. That confidence comes through abiding [dwelling; remaining] in Him (**John 15:10** and **Revelation 22:14**).
  - B. We have the information given to us to KNOW (I John 5:11-13).
    - 1. Credible men (**II Corinthians 12:12**) have given us inspired information (**I John 1:1-2**) that we may have full assurance [entire confidence] (**Hebrews 10:22-23**).
    - 2. Even if we have come from the depths of darkness, we can know be confident in our salvation (I Timothy 1:12-17 and Titus 3:3-8).
  - C. No fear concerning our salvation (Hebrews 2:9-18).
    - 1. Fear should motivate continued obedience (Acts 10:35 and Philippians 2:12) and provide confidence (Proverbs 14:26; 19:23).
    - 2. Yet, when you're confident you're obedience is in accordance with His will, you should know you're saved (**Isaiah 50:10** and **Hebrews 5:8-9**).
  - D. We live under the law of liberty (James 1:21-25; 2:12).
    - 1. Our Savior never intended for us, whom are saved, to be overly burdened (Matthew 11:28-30).
    - 2. Liberty in not something we should take and use to make us feel insecure and overly burdened (**Galatians 5:1**).
- III. Conclusion: If you are of the truth.... You are confident (I John 3:19-21).
