I. Introduction:

- A. This lesson is in NO WAY intended to be taken as a unity in diversity lesson regarding the ONE FAITH (**Philippians 3:16**).
 - 1. Teaching cannot vary amongst congregations (I Corinthians 4:17).
 - 2. The expectation is of like-mindedness (**II Corinthians 13:11**) as becometh [worthy] of the Gospel (**Philippians 1:27**).
- B. To establish my point a bit right from the jump, unity according to the will of the Lord, is to be one as they are one (**John 17:20-23**).
 - 1. The Father, Son, and Spirit are one (I John 5:7), but are also separate beings (Matthew 3:16-17).
 - 2. They had/have unique roles (I Corinthians 11:3).
 - a. The Father sent the Son for a unique role (I John 4:14).
 - b. The Father sent the Spirit for a unique role (John 14:26).
 - c. *Do not take the points above as the whole of the work of God, just a simple example of uniqueness while unified.
- II. Body: The Local Church Is Not Intended To Have All The Members The Same As Each Other (I Corinthians 14:24-27).
 - A. Some are more capable in certain areas than others (Matthew 25:14-15).
 - 1. However, even if you're MR. or MRS. AMAZING, how should you view others (**Philippians 2:3-11**)?
 - 2. Should you think so highly of yourself that you think you are the epitome of manhood or womanhood (**Romans 12:3**)?
 - 3. At the end of the day, <u>regarding the flesh</u>, you and I are just dirt (**Genesis 3:19**).
 - 4. Whatever it is you can do, remember to whom you should give the glory for that (I Peter 4:9-11).
 - 5. The fact is and always will be, Christians have different roles to fill as we are not all alike (**Romans 12:4-5**).
 - B. Within the realm of authorized liberties, some make choices different than others (I Corinthians 7:6-8 and I Corinthians 9:5).
 - 1. Some choose to celebrate certain days while others don't (**Romans 14:5-6**).
 - 2. Some choices will leave some in a better spiritual position than others, but that doesn't make those choices wrong (I Corinthians 7:31-34).
 - a. Having children is an additional distraction because of the work entailed therein (**Proverbs 4:1**, **Proverbs 22:6**, **Proverbs 29:15**, and **Colossians 3:21**).
 - b. Yet, if it is taught not to marry and have children there would be no chance of elders (**Titus 1:5-6**).

- C. It is wrong for you to measure others by considering yourself to be the standard (**II Corinthians 10:12**).
 - 1. It is not who or what you think is <u>something</u> that matters, but rather who the Lord commends that matters (**II Corinthians 10:18**).
 - 2. Don't seek to glorify yourself (Proverbs 25:27).
 - 3. Think about those that use worldly standards to declare what is good or great (**Luke 16:15**).
 - a. "He is uneducated" (I Corinthians 3:18-19).
 - b. "She is not attractive" (Proverbs 31:30).
 - c. "They are not successful" (Proverbs 13:7).
 - d. "He is not very manly looking" (Isaiah 53:2-3).
- III. Conclusion: Consider what matters most (Jeremiah 9:23-24).
