## God Was Not Talking To You Or I In These Verses...

## I. Introduction:

- A. Some Scriptures are very obviously not directed toward you or I (i.e. II Timothy 4:13; II Timothy 4:19-22).
  - 1. Even when they are not written directly to us there are sometimes applications to be made for us (**Colossians 4:15-16**).
  - 2. Even Scriptures that do no direct apply should still be taught (Romans 15:4), but handled correctly (II Timothy 2:15 and II Peter 3:15-17).
- B. Making sure not to draw unnecessary inferences (John 20:14-23).
  - 1. For example, can you really read **Romans 8:28** and think that everything will always be good if you are godly (**Matthew 20:17-19** and **John 15:18-21**)?
  - 2. What you have to do with **Romans 8:28** is see how the context refers to spiritual things (**Romans 8:29-39**).
- II. Body: We Must Handle The Scriptures Properly (II Corinthians 4:2).
  - A. The "everything will be okay" verses such as **Isaiah 43:2** and **Jeremiah 29:11...** 
    - 1. Who is addressed in **Isaiah 43:1-3**?
    - 2. Who is addressed in **Jeremiah 29:10-13**?
    - 3. Under the Law of Moses, obedience to God provided ISRAEL (Leviticus 25:1-2) with safety (Leviticus 25:18-19).
    - 4. Is the life of a Christian, carnally speaking, promised to be "good" (John 16:33, Acts 14:22, and Il Timothy 3:10-12)?
  - B. The idea that our country can repent and the land healed from verses such as **II Chronicles 7:14...** 
    - 1. "My people" was then in reference to Israel (I Kings 8:16 and Ezekiel 34:30)
    - 2. God was talking to Solomon (II Chronicles 7:12-14).
    - 3. While there may be lessons to learn from these Scriptures (**Romans 15:4**), there is not a direct application to our country (**Romans 7:1-6**).
    - 4. God's city and nation is not a physical place anymore (**Hebrews** 12:22-23 and I Peter 2:5-9).
  - C. The idea that God will give you anything you ask for from reading **Matthew 21:22**.
    - 1. Isn't the context about miracles (Matthew 21:17-22)?
    - 2. Doesn't God explicitly tell us we can ask for things and not receive them (James 4:3)?
    - 3. Isn't prayer based on God's will rather than our own (I John 5:14-15)?
    - 4. Understand the N.T. was written during a time when miracles occurred and thus many prayers will not be valid today because they surrounded miraculous times. These things have ceased (I Corinthians 12:3-13:13).
  - D. People who think they Spirit of God abides in them because they misapply Scriptures like **Ephesians 1:13**.
    - 1. How did the Ephesians receive the Holy Spirit (Acts 19:1-7)?

- 2. Since Apostles gave the Spirit (**Acts 8:12-24**) you know this doesn't apply now because...
  - a. To be an Apostle one had to be an eyewitness of the resurrected Christ (**Acts 1:22**).
  - b. Paul was the last to see Him (I Corinthians 15:8).
  - c. Therefore the Spirit is not given anymore, as there are no Apostles to do so.
  - d. Lest confusion arise, there is no H.S. baptism as we read of in **Acts 2:1-4** anymore either (**Ephesians 4:5**; cf. **I Peter 3:20-21**).
- III. Conclusion: Not properly knowing the Scriptures will cause us to err (**Matthew 22:29**).
