## **Growing In What You Already Know**

## I. Introduction:

- A. We know that we are supposed to grow; to mature in Christ (**Proverbs 19:2**, **Ephesians 4:14-16**, and **II Peter 3:18**).
  - 1. We cannot begin to think though that constant learning is all we have to do. That, in itself, can mean nothing (**II Timothy 3:6-7**).
  - 2. Proper knowledge should be <u>useful</u> to you spiritually and physically (**Proverbs 2:1-22**, **Isaiah 33:6**, and **Colossians 3:10**).
- B. With knowledge comes accountability (James 4:17).
  - 1. For whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required (**Luke 12:47-48**).
  - 2. Knowledge has to be used properly (**Proverbs 15:1-2**).

## II. Body: I Thessalonians 4:1-2 and I Thessalonians 4:9-12

- A. Allowing the increase to come through the knowledge you have already obtained (II Peter 1:1-12).
  - 1. It's not that we don't have to be reminded (II Peter 3:1-2).
  - 2. At the same time, we should spend a good amount of time processing and applying what we presently know (**Joshua 1:1-8** and **I Timothy 4:15**).
  - 3. Abounding more and more in what you already know (**Philippians** 1:8-11).
- B. Not needing taught again, but rather living it; applying it (Colossians 1:9-10).
  - 1. The word of God is able to save us (**James 1:21**), but His words are also words to "live by" (**Luke 4:4**).
  - 2. Through His word we are able to be fruitful (Matthew 13:23).
  - 3. Being fruitful in every good work (**John 15:1-5**, **Titus 3:8**; **3:14**, and **I Peter 2:11-12**).
- C. We have to be careful about gaining knowledge (I Corinthians 8:1). Thus, it is good to measure our motives for growing in knowledge?
  - 1. Is it just to reach an earthly accomplishment even if it is a good accomplishment (i.e. I Timothy 3:1-2)?
  - 2. Is it to cure curiosities and if so, to what end (Acts 17:16-34)?
  - 3. Is it a "badge of honor" for an outward show (**Proverbs 12:23**)?
  - 4. Is it to misapply I Peter 3:15 or Jude 1:3? See contexts!
- III. Conclusion: We must all reach a point of growth wherein we don't have to learn, relearn, etc.; but get on with faithfully; fruitfully living it (**Hebrews 5:5-6:12**).
