## "If My Kingdom Were Of This World"

## I. Introduction:

- A. People have long misunderstood the spiritual nature of the kingdom of Christ (**Luke 17:20-21**).
  - 1. They wanted Christ to be an earthly king (**John 6:15**).
  - 2. After much teaching, they still perceived the kingdom and Christ in an earthly sense (**Acts 1:6-11**).
- B. When talking about the kingdom of Christ there are a few things that could be meant.
  - 1. For example, one could be talking about the kingdom in reference to being in Heaven (I Corinthians 15:24; 15:50-53 and II Timothy 4:18).
  - 2. Another example, one could be talking about the kingdom in reference to the church; the followers of Christ on earth (Colossians 1:12-13) and even the angels of heaven (Hebrews 12:22-23; 12:28).
  - 3. Whether of the current (**Revelation 1:9**) or future (**James 2:5**); the kingdom refers to the people of the Lord.
- II. Body: Our Lesson Comes From A Discussion Between Jesus and Pilate (**John 18:33-37**).
  - A. The kingdom, of which we as saints are citizens of, belongs to Christ and our Father (**Ephesians 5:5** and **II Timothy 4:1**).
    - 1. To answer Pilate's inquiry, YES Jesus is the king (I Timothy 6:14-15).
    - 2. So, what does that mean about His authority (**Ephesians 1:20-23** and **I Peter 3:22**)?
  - B. Since we have a heavenly King (**Hebrews 1:1-3**), what's that mean for our mindset and actions?
    - 1. Those whom are saints are called by the Gospel (II Thessalonians 2:14) unto His Kingdom (I Thessalonians 2:12).
    - 2. Our conversation [citizenship; Strong's # 4175] is in Heaven (**Philippians 3:20**).
    - 3. Therefore, we are not supposed to be worldly (**Galatians 1:3-4** and **I John 2:15-17**).
      - a. How does that affect choices we make (Luke 18:18-30)?
      - b. How does that affect carnal relationships (**Proverbs 29:27**)?
    - 4. Think about Jesus' statements and prayer concerning His disciples (**John 15:18-20** and **John 17:9-23**).
    - 5. For us who have escaped, don't turn back (II Peter 2:20-22).
  - C. With all of that, what can we then consider about "our fight" and why the servants of the Lord did not fight carnally (**I Timothy 6:12**)?
    - 1. The faithful will boldly (**Proverbs 28:1**) contend earnestly for the faith (**Jude 1:3-4**).
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- 2. The faithful will boldly engage in a certain kind of warfare (**I Timothy** 1:18).
- 3. Like Paul (I Corinthians 11:1), the faithful will be set for the defense of the Gospel (Philippians 1:12-17).
- 4. Our weaponry and our warfare is not carnal (**II Corinthians 10:1-5** and **Ephesians 6:10-17**).
- 5. We are not people of strife [contentious] (Romans 13:13-14 and Philippians 2:3).
- III. Conclusion: The characteristics of the kingdom are the very opposite of what we see in this world (**Romans 14:17**).
