If That Which Was Done Away Was Glorious

I. Introduction:

- A. The Law of Moses and the system therein was never perfect (Romans 8:1-3 and Hebrews 7:11-28).
 - 1. The Law of Moses did not save for it could not justify anyone (Acts 13:38-39, Galatians 3:10-12, and Galatians 3:21-29).
 - 2. Thankfully, Christ brought something else (John 1:17).
- B. Before we get into this lesson that could bring about many points, think how...
 - 1. The faithful of old loved a law that could not save them (**Psalms 119:97**; **113**; **163**)?
 - 2. How much greater should we love the words of Christ and keep them (**John 14:21**)?
 - 3. What happens if we don't love the new law (II Thessalonians 2:10)?
- II. Body: Much More That Which Remaineth (II Corinthians 3:3-18).
 - A. A law not meant for tables of stone (**Exodus 34:1**), but for the hearts of believers (**Romans 6:17**; **10:6-17**).
 - 1. Working in a certain type of heart (**Luke 8:15**).
 - 2. His word that should indwell us (Colossians 3:16 and II John 1:2).
 - 3. Now think about this... The Old Law (as incomplete and hopeless as it was) was effective on hearts (**Psalms 37:30-31**), what should the word of hope that is meant to work on hearts do in our hearts (**James 1:21-27**)?
 - B. A glorious law of hope that brought what the "old" could not (Hebrews 8:1-13).
 - 1. Those under the old law hoped in the word (**Psalms 119:114**), but the real hope was a hidden mystery to them now revealed to <u>us</u> (**Colossians 1:27** and **I Peter 1:3-13**).
 - 2. Think about how the hope we have in Christ should motivate us (Romans 12:11-12, Colossians 1:23, I Thessalonians 1:3, Hebrews 3:6, Hebrews 6:9, and I John 3:1-3).
 - C. A glorious law of liberty (James 1:25; 2:12).
 - 1. Freedom from a hopeless, restrictive law (**Galatians 5:1-4**).
 - 2. Freedom from sin (Romans 6:15-23).
 - D. A law that changes us into the image [likeness; representation; resemblance] of the Lord (**Colossians 3:1-10**).
 - 1. An ability to become a new person (II Corinthians 5:14-17; 6:14-7:1).
 - 2. Restored to what God created man to be (I Peter 1:13-16; cf. Genesis 1:26-27).
- III. Conclusion: We live under a glorious law (I Timothy 1:8-16).
