## John 1:1-5

## <u>Introduction Thoughts On The Book Of John:</u>

- A. There was two predominate persons known as "John" in the N.T. How do we know who penned the "Book of John" (as well as 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> John, and Revelation)?
  - 1. There was "John the Baptist" (Matthew 3:1).
    - a. He was a great man (Matthew 11:11-12).
    - b. We will be talking about John the Baptist in the very first chapter of John (John 1:6, etc.).
    - c. John the Baptist died before Jesus did (Matthew 14:1-12).
    - d. Therefore, we know he could NOT have been the penman since the Book of John goes through the life and death of our Lord (John 21:14).
  - 2. The John who penned this book is obviously the Apostle known as John (Matthew 10:2).
    - a. While John is the penman, the author is God (II Timothy 3:16-17).
      - i. Inspiration does not occur without the Father's role (John 14:23-24 and John 17:17).
      - ii. Inspiration does not occur without the Son's role (**Hebrews 1:1-2**).
      - iii. Inspiration does not occur without the Holy Spirit's role (II Samuel 23:2, John 16:12-13, I Corinthians 2:9-13, and II Peter 1:19-21).
    - b. Deity, in all three persons, worked together to bring us the truth (**John 14:26**).
  - 3. No "argument" could be made that John (a.k.a. Mark) was the penman (Acts 12:25) as he was not with the Lord.
- B. Any book of the Bible is profitable to study (II Timothy 3:16-17).
  - 1. The book of John has a goal we read about in the end of this book (John 20:30-31; 21:24-25).
  - 2. We'll see a greater focus on the end of our Lord's life than Matthew, Mark, or Luke offer.

## The Text of John 1:1-5:

- **John 1:1-2** "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God."
  - A. In the beginning (**Genesis 1:1**).
    - 1. Christ precedes the beginning of the earth (John 17:5 and Colossians 1:17).
    - 2. The plan for Christ precedes the beginning as well (**Ephesians 3:8-11, II Timothy 1:9, Titus 1:2**, and **I Peter 1:18-25**).
  - B. "The Word" is Christ (John 1:14).
  - C. "The Word" was with God (John 3:13; 16:28).
    - 1. Heaven has three persons as deity (Matthew 28:19 and I John 5:7).
    - 2. Christ was to return to the Father (John 14:28; 20:17) and He did so (Acts 1:4-11).

- D. "The Word" was/is God (John 10:30-33; cf. Hebrews 13:8).
  - 1. The Scriptures plainly declare the deity of Christ while He was on earth (Matthew 1:23, John 5:16-17, John 20:26-29, Acts 20:28, Romans 9:1-5, and I Timothy 3:16).
  - 2. The Scriptures plainly declare the deity of Christ before and after He was on earth (John 8:56-58, Titus 2:13, Hebrews 1:8-9, and I John 5:20).
  - 3. The works of Christ declare the deity of Christ:
    - a. Forgiving sins (Mark 2:1-10).
    - b. He taught that only God is to be worshipped (Matthew 4:9-10).
    - c. He accepted worship (Matthew 8:1-4, Matthew 9:18, Matthew 28:9;
    - **17**, Luke 24:49-53, and John 9:35-38), proving He is deity (Acts 10:25-26 and Revelation 22:8-9).
  - 4. Think of **Hebrews 1:3**.
    - a. We are created in the image of God (**Genesis 1:27** and **I Corinthians 15:45**).
      - i. In this manner, we have a spirit (Genesis 2:7).
      - ii. We are not deity equal to the Father, Son, or the Holy Spirit (Ecclesiastes 12:13-14).
    - b. Christ is the "express image" [5481: "the exact expression (the image) of any person or thing, marked likeness, precise reproduction in every respect, i.e facsimile" (Thayer)] of the person of God (II Corinthians 4:3-4).
    - c. In other words, Christ is one with His Father (John 10:30; cf. Colossians 1:18-19).
  - 5. Jesus declared that if anyone had seen Him, they had seen the Father (John 8:19, John 12:45, John 14:8-11, and John 15:24).
- **John 1:3** "All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made."
  - A. You cannot have the creation without Christ (Colossians 1:12-16 and Hebrews 1:10-13).
  - B. Nothing was made without the involvement of Jesus (I Corinthians 8:6).
- John 1:4 "In him was life; and the life was the light of men."
  - A. In Christ was/is life (John 5:21, John 11:25, John 14:6, and I John 5:11).
    - 1. Redemption is in Christ (Romans 3:24).
    - 2. All are made alive in Christ (I Corinthians 15:22).
    - 3. We are new creatures in Christ (II Corinthians 5:17).
    - 4. To summarize: All spiritual blessings are in Christ (Ephesians 1:3).
    - 5. The above benefits "in Christ" require us getting into Christ (**Galatians 3:26-27**).
  - B. Christ is the light for men (John 8:12, Acts 26:22-23, and Ephesians 5:13-14).
- John 1:5 "And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not."
  - A. Christ shined in darkness (John 12:46 and Acts 26:18; cf. Ephesians 5:8).
  - B. They knew Him not (John 1:10, John 3:19-21, John 12:36-40, and I Corinthians 2:14).
