John 5:19-23

John 5:19-20 – "(19) Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise. (20) For the Father loveth the Son, and sheweth him all things that himself doeth: and he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel."

- A. The Son can do nothing of Himself (John 5:24, John 5:30, John 8:28, and John 12:49).
 - 1. Jesus saying, "what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise" shows unity with the Father (John 10:30, John 14:10, John 17:22, and I John 5:7).
 - 2. Jesus patterned His work after the Father (Hebrews 8:5).
 - 3. There are unified roles carried out in the godhead (John 14:26, John 16:13, and I Corinthians 11:3).
- B. The Father loves the Son (Matthew 3:17, John 3:35, and John 17:26).
 - 1. God showed Jesus all things that He did (Luke 10:22 and John 10:32).
 - 2. Great works were to be shown in the future, even through the disciples (**John 14:11-12**). The raising of the dead is certainly more marvelous (*More on this in verse 21 and again in verses 25ff.).
 - 3. These great things will cause people to marvel (Luke 24:12 and Luke 24:40-41).

John 5:21-22 – "(21) For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and quickeneth them; even so the Son quickeneth whom he will. (22) For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son."

- A. The Father causes the dead to be raised (**Deuteronomy 32:39** and **II Kings 4:32-35**).
 - 1. Some do not think that God can raise the dead (Acts 26:6-8).
 - 2. Without the resurrection of the dead we are hopeless (I Corinthians 15:16-19).
 - 3. Additionally, Jesus shows that He too can raise anyone He chooses from the dead (Luke 7:11-15, Luke 8:49-56, John 11:25, and John 11:43-44).
- B. The Father is not the judge as He has given that role to Christ (Matthew 11:27, Acts 10:38-42, Acts 17:29-31, and Romans 2:16).
 - 1. It is Jesus coming back to Judge (Matthew 25:31-34 and II Thessalonians 1:7-9).
 - 2. The standard of the Judgment will be the words of Christ (John 12:48).

John 5:23 – "That all men should honour the Son, even as they honour the Father. He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him."

- A. All men should honor the Son (Matthew 17:5, Luke 12:8-9, and Hebrews 1:6).
 - 1. This means Jesus is worthy of worship (Matthew 28:9-10).

- 2. Glory is to be given to Christ (John 11:4 and II Peter 3:18).
- 3. If we do not honor Christ we dishonor the Father (John 15:23, I John 2:23, and II John 9).
- B. Caution: some specific instructions still have to be obeyed when honoring Christ (cf. II Peter 3:16-17).
 - 1. We are to pray to the Father, not the Son (Matthew 6:7-9, Ephesians 5:20, Colossians 1:12, and I Timothy 2:5).
 - 2. We assemble to worship the Father while rejoicing in Christ (Philippians 3:3).
 - 3. To illustrate this, let's consider our partaking of the Lord's Supper:
 - a. Who are we remembering when partaking of the unleavened bread and fruit of the vine (**Luke 22:19-20** and **I Corinthians 11:26**)?
 - b. Jesus did not give thanks to Himself (I Corinthians 11:23-24).
 - c. Thus, we partake of the unleavened bread and fruit of the vine while remembering Christ, but we give thanks for those emblems to God the Father (Colossians 3:17).
