Let's Talk About Stubbornness

I. Introduction:

- A. Wisdom says hear and refuse not (**Proverbs 8:32-33**).
 - 1. To refuse instruction is to hate your own soul (Proverbs 15:31-32).
 - 2. There are consequences (Hebrews 12:24-25).
- B. Some people just want to hold to their own ways (Isaiah 65:2).
 - 1. There are many problems with that, one of which is that man doesn't know the best way (**Proverbs 20:24**).
 - 2. When people are dead-set in certain ways, they revolt and are gone (**Jeremiah 5:22-23**).

II. Body: Judges 2:8-21

- A. Think back to what God told Moses (Exodus 32:9, Exodus 33:1-5, Deuteronomy 9:6, and Deuteronomy 9:13). *Same Hebrew word in Judges 2:19 is translated "stiffnecked" in the aforementioned passages (Strong's # 7186).
 - 1. Israel's stubbornness was obvious to Moses too (**Deuteronomy 31:27**).
 - 2. Fast forward generations later... (Isaiah 48:1-6 and Acts 7:51-52).
- B. Think about trying to reach a stubborn person(s) (Ezekiel 2:1-5).
 - 1. They won't listen (**Ezekiel 3:7**). *Again, same Hebrew word as in Judges 2:19
 - 2. Even with drastic measures, great efforts to teach, etc.; it is very tough to reach stubborn people even from generations forward (**Nehemiah 9:6-38**).
- C. The solution of knowledge, hope, recollection, obedience, are all tied to setting the heart aright (**Psalms 78:1-8**).
 - 1. Think about a heart contrast (II Chronicles 12:13-14 and Ezra 7:10).
 - 2. There just has to be an open heart (**Deuteronomy 10:16**).
 - 3. Furthermore, it is very helpful to have support (**Hebrews 3:13**).
- III. Conclusion: Don't be a stubborn person (I Samuel 15:23 and Psalms 32:8-9).
