## **None That Doeth Good**

## I. Introduction:

- A. Is doing good impossible? Why does God say to do good if such is impossible (**III John 1:11**)?
  - 1. Doing good was commanded under the Law of Moses (**Psalms 34:14**; **37:3**; **37:27**).
  - 2. The same is true under the New Covenant (**Galatians 6:10** and **I Peter 3:8-12**).
- B. The Judgment Day will separate those that do good and those that do not (**John 5:28-29**).
  - 1. The expectation for the saved is to have worked good (**Romans** 2:6-10).
  - 2. What will I reap if I truly cannot work good (Galatians 6:7-10)?
- II. Body: What Then Is Meant By The Statement "None That Doeth Good" (**Romans 3:12**)?
  - A. There are Psalms that say there is none that do good (**Psalms 14:1** and **Psalms 53:1**).
    - 1. These contexts are about fools who worked iniquity (**Psalms 14:1-4**; **53:1-4**).
    - 2. Other Psalms said there were good men (**Psalms 112:5**; **125:4**). So, we cannot conclude these Psalms are saying everyone cannot do good.
  - B. Solomon said there is not a just man that doeth good (Ecclesiastes 7:20).
    - 1. The context talks about having a good reputation (Ecclesiastes 7:1) and even about a just man (Ecclesiastes 7:15). Is he contradicting himself? Was his time a time of evil? Is this hyperbole?
    - 2. Solomon has talked of a good man (**Proverbs 12:2**; **13:22**; **14:14** and **Ecclesiastes 3:12**). Is he confused?
    - 3. Notice in the context of **Ecclesiastes 7:20** what is said in **Ecclesiastes 7:13-19**. Think on that. Can a man be so righteous as to overturn wickedness or so wicked as to overthrow righteousness? What about self-righteousness?
  - C. Aha! Self-righteousness... Go back and read **Romans 3:9-24**. The contextual point was that both Jews and Gentiles needed the Savior. Neither, by their own good works, could be made righteous without Christ.
    - 1. Self-righteousness gets you nowhere (**Proverbs 30:12**, **Luke 18:9-14**, and **Romans 10:1-3**).
    - 2. That does not mean there were not "good men" (Luke 23:50 and Acts 11:22-24).
    - 3. Also, concerning Barnabas, he is evidence that one can be a good man and blow it (**Galatians 2:13**).

- D. The truth of the matter is that <u>sinners</u> need the Lord to be made righteous and no amount of good works apart from Christ can make <u>the sinner</u> righteous (**Ephesians 2:1-10**).
  - 1. Paul made this clear (Philippians 3:8-11).
  - 2. Being made righteousness is not through our own works (**II Timothy 1:9** and **Titus 3:3-7**).
  - 3. When we do all we are supposed to do, there is no extra credit (**Luke 17:7-10**).
  - 4. Apart from Christ, your good works are useless (**John 15:3-6**).
    - a. Don't run from the extreme of all works salvation to the other extreme of no works salvation (**Titus 3:8** and **James 2:14-26**).
    - b. You have a role in being saved (Acts 2:40, Philippians 2:12, and I Timothy 4:13-16).
- III. Conclusion: Be the good man that brings forth good fruit (**Luke 6:43-45**).
