O Praise The Lord

- I. Introduction: As we work on putting more Scriptural songs into our songbook...
 - A. David, an inspired man (**II Samuel 23:1-2**), rightly stated the Lord is worthy to be praised (**II Samuel 22:1-4** and **Psalms 18:1-3**).
 - 1. We see such in Israel's history (Ezra 3:10-11).
 - 2. We see such in faithful saints in Christ Jesus (Acts 2:46-47).
 - 3. Even God's angels praise Him (Luke 2:8-14).
 - B. Praise, in various forms, is partly defined: "...to make a show..." (Strong's # H1984), "...song or hymn of praise..." (Strong's # H8416), "...to celebrate in song or music..." (Strong's # H2167), "to hymn, i.e. sing a religious ode; by implication, to celebrate God in song..." (Strong's # G5214), etc.
 - 1. As we briefly study this subject, pay attention to the ties between praising God with rejoicing and being thankful (I Thessalonians 5:16-18).
 - 2. You also cannot miss the tie between praising God and singing (**Judges 5:3**, **Jeremiah 20:13**, and **Hebrews 2:12**).

II. Body: **Psalms 117:1-2**

- A. Praise Him for...
 - 1. His mercy and kindness (Titus 3:3-5).
 - 2. That which is directed toward us (II Timothy 1:8-12, II Peter 1:3-4, and I John 5:11; 5:20).
 - 3. For the truth that endures forever (Psalms 110:5 and I Peter 1:22-25).
 - 4. And more... (Psalms 28:7, Psalms 43:5, Psalms 150:2, Daniel 4:34, I Peter 2:9, etc.).
- B. What can we learn about praise from **Hebrews 13:12-15**?
 - 1. Thanksgiving surrounds singing praises to God (Colossians 3:15-17).
 - 2. Such praises ought to be a continual act in our lives (**Psalms 71:14**).
 - 3. Plenty more to think of too... Psalms 118:14-21
- C. Think about praise from **Romans 15:1-12**...
 - 1. Why do we Gentiles have plenty of reason to praise God (Acts 10:1-11:18 and Ephesians 2:1-17)?
 - 2. Don't we have to have our minds focused to see what is worthy of praise (**Philippians 4:6-8**)?
 - 3. How could we accomplish that if we set our hearts on despair (Ecclesiastes 2:18-26; cf. James 5:13)?
- D. Think about Paul and Silas (Acts 16:13-25).
 - 1. What would cause those suffering to praise God (I Peter 1:3-9)?
 - 2. Doesn't it come down to perspective (I Peter 4:12-14)?
