Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 134 – Lying Lips Through The Lips Of The Righteous (Proverbs 10:18-32)

1. What does the Lord call one who hides hatred with lies and those who uttereth a slander?

"He that hideth hatred with lying lips, and he that uttereth a slander, is a fool" (Proverbs 10:18).

- * Hiding hatred with lying lips (I Samuel 18:20-29, Proverbs 24:1-2, Proverbs 26:24-26, and Jeremiah 9:3-8).
- * Slandering does not go unpunished (**Psalms 101:5** and **Romans 3:8**).
- 2. Is it easier to sin when one speaks too much?

Yes: "In the multitude of words there wanteth not sin: but he that refraineth his lips is wise" (**Proverbs 10:19**).

- * A fool is full of words (**Ecclesiastes 10:14**) rather than realizing it's best to just shut up (**Proverbs 17:27-28**).
- * Everything we say will be brought into judgment (**Proverbs 13:3** and **Matthew 12:34-37**).
- * We should always think carefully about what we say (**Proverbs 15:28**; cf. **I Peter 4:11**).
- 3. Is the tongue of the just considered valuable by God?

Yes: "The tongue of the just is as choice silver: the heart of the wicked is little worth" (**Proverbs 10:20**).

- * Proverbs 12:18, Proverbs 15:4, and Proverbs 25:11-12.
- 4. Do righteous lips help others?

Yes: "The lips of the righteous feed many: but fools die for want of wisdom" (**Proverbs** 10:21).

- * Job 4:3-4, Jeremiah 3:15, and Matthew 4:4.
- 5. Do the blessings of the Lord come with sorrow?

No: "The blessing of the LORD, it maketh rich, and he addeth no sorrow with it" (**Proverbs 10:22**).

* With the blessings of the Lord we find times to rejoice (**Deuteronomy 12:7**).

6. Do fools take doing mischievous things seriously?

No: "It is as sport to a fool to do mischief: but a man of understanding hath wisdom" (**Proverbs 10:23**).

- * Proverbs 14:9, Proverbs 15:21, Ecclesiastes 5:1, and Hosea 7:1-2.
- 7. How does Job 3:25 fit into our context?

Job 3:25 says: "For the thing which I greatly feared is come upon me, and that which I was afraid of is come unto me."

Now, from our context we see this: "The fear of the wicked, it shall come upon him: but the desire of the righteous shall be granted" (**Proverbs 10:24**).

8. Do the wicked have an everlasting foundation?

No, but the righteous do: "As the whirlwind passeth, so is the wicked no more: but the righteous is an everlasting foundation" (**Proverbs 10:25**).

- * The wicked are cut off (**Psalms 37:9-10**). They are destroyed as a whirlwind (**Proverbs 1:24-28**).
- * The righteous do have an everlasting foundation (II Timothy 2:19).
- 9. Is it wise to send a sluggard [lazy person] to do a task?

No: "As vinegar to the teeth, and as smoke to the eyes, so is the sluggard to them that send him" (**Proverbs 10:26**).

- * Send a faithful messenger (**Proverbs 25:13**).
- 10. What does the fear of the Lord prolong?

"The fear of the LORD <u>prolongeth days</u>: but the years of the wicked shall be shortened" (**Proverbs 10:27**).

- * Proverbs 19:23
- 11. Will the wicked that work iniquity escape destruction?

No: "(28) The hope of the righteous shall be gladness: but the expectation of the wicked shall perish. (29) The way of the LORD is strength to the upright: but destruction shall be to the workers of iniquity" (**Proverbs 10:28-29**).

- * Psalms 1:6, Proverbs 14:32, Proverbs 21:15, and Romans 6:23.
- 12. How do we know that Proverbs 10:30 is not teaching an eternal earth doctrine?
 - * When Christ returns the earth will be destroyed (Matthew 24:35-36, II Peter 3:10-14, and I John 2:17).
 - * Under the Old Testament their inheritance was upon this earth (Exodus 20:12, Deuteronomy 1:21, Joshua 1:6, and Ezekiel 20:42).

13. What was to be done to the froward [perverse] tongue?

"The mouth of the just bringeth forth wisdom: but **the froward tongue shall be cut** out" (Proverbs 10:31).

- * Mouths that speak words that are perverse have to be silenced (**Psalms 31:18** and **Titus 1:10-11**).
- * On the other hand, wisdom comes out of the mouth of the just (Psalms 37:30).
- 14. Do righteous individuals know what is acceptable?

Yes: "The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable: but the mouth of the wicked speaketh forwardness" (Proverbs 10:32).

- * We have to know what is acceptable in our speech (Ecclesiastes 12:10 and Titus 2:7-8).
- * We have to control our tongues (Psalms 34:13, Proverbs 4:24, James 1:26, and I Peter 3:8-11).
