## **Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths**

Part 135 – False Balances Through Surety For A Stranger (Proverbs 11:1-15)

1. What is God's view of a false balance [scale]?

God does not appreciate those who try to cheat, lie, and steal by false measurements: "A false balance is abomination to the LORD: but a just weight is his delight" (Proverbs 11:1).

- \* Leviticus 19:35-36, Deuteronomy 25:13-16, Proverbs 16:11, Proverbs 20:10, Proverbs 20:23, and Hosea 12:7.
- 2. What comes with pride?

"When pride cometh, then cometh shame: but with the lowly is wisdom" (**Proverbs 11:2**; cf. **Proverbs 16:18-19** and **Luke 18:10-14**).

3. What guides the upright and what destroys the transgressors?

"The integrity of the upright shall guide them: but the perverseness of transgressors shall destroy them... The righteousness of the perfect shall direct his way: but the wicked shall fall by his own wickedness" (**Proverbs 11:3; 5**).

- \* Integrity and righteousness of the upright (**Psalms 26:1** and **Proverbs 13:6**).
- \* The perverseness of transgressors (**Proverbs 28:18**; cf. **Proverbs 21:7**).
- 4. Will riches be able to save someone's soul?

No: "Riches profit not in the day of wrath: but ..." (Proverbs 11:4a.; cf. Job 36:18-19, Psalms 49:6-7, Proverbs 10:2, Matthew 16:26, and James 5:1-3).

5. What delivers the upright?

"(4b.) ...but righteousness delivereth from death. (5) The righteousness of the perfect shall direct his way: but the wicked shall fall by his own wickedness. (6) The righteousness of the upright shall deliver them: but transgressors shall be taken in their own naughtiness" (**Proverbs 11:4b.-6**).

- \* Righteousness delivers from death (Proverbs 12:28 and I Peter 4:17-19).
- 6. What happens to the expectation [hope] of a wicked man when he dies?

  His hope is gone: "When a wicked man dieth, his expectation shall perish: and the hope of unjust men perisheth" (Proverbs 11:7).
  - \* The wicked now suffer after death (**Luke 16:19-31**), but the righteous has hope in death (**Proverbs 14:32** and **Luke 23:43**).
- 7. When the righteous were delivered out of trouble, what happened to the wicked?

- "The righteous is delivered out of trouble, and the wicked cometh in his stead" (**Proverbs 11:8**).
- \* This was true when God's hand was miraculously involved in the affairs of His people (Esther 6:4; 7:3-10, Proverbs 21:18, and Daniel 6:23-24).
- 8. What harm does a hypocrite bring to his or her neighbor?

  "An hypocrite with his mouth destroyeth his neighbour: but through knowledge shall the just be delivered" (Proverbs 11:9; cf. Job 34:30 and Matthew 15:1-14).
- 9. Do righteous individuals bring good things to the cities they live in?

  Yes: "(10) When it goeth well with the righteous, the city rejoiceth: and when the wicked perish, there is shouting. (11) By the blessing of the upright the city is exalted: but it is overthrown by the mouth of the wicked" (Proverbs 11:10-11).
  - \* Genesis 18:20-32, Ecclesiastes 9:15, Jeremiah 5:1, and Matthew 5:13-16.
- 10. Do wise individuals despise their neighbors?

  No, those void of wisdom despise their neighbors: "He that is void of wisdom despiseth his neighbour: but a man of understanding holdeth his peace" (**Proverbs** 11:12).
  - \* Wise individuals love their neighbors, because God commands such (**Leviticus 19:18**, **Matthew 19:19**, **Romans 13:9-10**, **Galatians 5:14**, and **James 2:8**). It is wise to obey that which God commands (**Proverbs 10:8**).
- 11. What is the difference between a talebearer and a faithful spirit?

  "A talebearer revealeth secrets: but he that is of a faithful spirit concealeth the matter"

  (Proverbs 11:13).
  - \* It's not good to be a talebearer (Leviticus 19:16, Proverbs 20:19, and Proverbs 26:20-22).
  - \* We certainly should not break confidences (**Proverbs 25:9**).
- 12. Is it a good thing when faithful counselors are not among the people?

  No: "Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety" (Proverbs 11:14; cf. Proverbs 15:22; 24:6).
  - \* Providing the counsel is godly (**Job 32:1-14**, **John 18:14**, and **Acts 13:6-10**).
- 13. Is it wise to be a surety [one taking responsibility for the debt of another] for a stranger?

No: "He that is surety for a stranger shall smart for it: and he that hateth suretiship is sure" (**Proverbs 11:15**).
