Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 138 – Self-Righteousness Through The Way Of Righteousness (Proverbs 12:15-28)

1. Will a foolish person listen to reason when they are wrong?

No: "The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise" (**Proverbs 12:15**).

- The fool is convinced their way is always right (**Proverbs 14:12**, **Proverbs 14:16**, **Proverbs 16:2**, **Proverbs 16:25**, **Proverbs 21:2**, **Proverbs 30:12**, **Luke 18:10-14**, and **Galatians 6:3**).
- We must never be wise in our own eyes (**Deuteronomy 12:8**, **Proverbs 3:7**, and **Isaiah 5:21**).
- Wise people will listen to wise, GODLY counsel (Proverbs 1:5 and Proverbs 19:20).
- 2. What's at least one difference between a fool and a prudent man?

"A fool's wrath is presently known: but a prudent [sensible; acting with or showing care and thought for the future; Strong's # 6175; BDB and New Oxford Dictionary] man covereth shame" (**Proverbs 12:16**).

- This is not meaning to hide one's side in a "cover-up" that is deceptive (**Proverbs 28:13**).
- What we are talking about is discretion rather than open flaunting of one's sinful behavior (Ezra 9:6). Godly people are ashamed of something one does that is wrong, not wanting to "put it on display" (Jeremiah 6:15; 8:12).
- 3. What do we need to speak to show forth righteousness?

"<u>He that speaketh truth sheweth forth righteousness</u>: but a false witness deceit" (**Proverbs 12:17**).

- **Psalms 15:1-2** and **Ephesians 5:9**.
- "A true witness delivereth souls: but a deceitful witness speaketh lies" (**Proverbs** 14:25).
- 4. Are words powerful enough to be helpful if right and harmful if wrong?

 Yes: "There is that speaketh like the piercings of a sword: but the tongue of the wise is

Yes: "There is that speaketh like the piercings of a sword: but the tongue of the wise is health" (**Proverbs 12:18**).

- As weapons: Psalms 57:4, Psalms 64:3, Proverbs 25:18, Ephesians 5:6, and II Timothy 2:17.
- For good: **Proverbs 15:7** and **Ephesians 4:29**.
- 5. Is it the truth speaker or the liar that has hope for a good future?

"The lip of truth shall be established for ever: but <u>a lying tongue is but for a moment</u>" (**Proverbs 12:19**). * Liars have a bad ending (**Acts 5:1-10** and **Revelation 21:8**).

6. What is in the heart of those that imagine evil?

"Deceit is in the heart of them that imagine evil: but to the counsellors of peace is joy" (**Proverbs 12:20**).

Proverbs 23:6-7 and Proverbs 26:23-28.

7. Is Proverbs 12:21 teaching that nothing bad will ever happen to people that are just (*note: consider Psalms 37:12-15, Matthew 23:34-35, Matthew 26:1-4, and II Timothy 3:12 when answering this question)?

Proverbs 12:21 says: "There shall no evil happen to the just: but the wicked shall be filled with mischief" (**Proverbs 12:21**).

- The verses given in the wording of the question prove we CANNOT be reading a Scripture that promises no harm will occur to just people (Matthew 5:10-12 and Luke 6:46).
- Thus, the Scripture must be discussing things in the overall scheme of our existence, which includes eternity (**II Corinthians 4:16-5:1**).
- 8. What does the Lord think about liars?

"Lying lips are abomination to the LORD: but they that deal truly are his delight" (**Proverbs 12:22**).

- Proverbs 6:16-19 and Revelation 21:8.
- Our attitude ought to be the same (**Psalms 119:163**, **Proverbs 13:5**, and **Ephesians 4:25**).
- 9. Rather than being prudent and using discretion with one's words, what does a fool do? "A prudent man concealeth knowledge: but the heart of fools proclaimeth foolishness" (Proverbs 12:23).
 - Proverbs 15:2, Proverbs 17:27-28, and Ecclesiastes 10:12-14.
- 10. What are two differences between the diligent man and the slothful man (based on verses 24; 27)?

Basic point, laziness never brings you to a point of success in anything, including providing for yourself: "The hand of the diligent shall bear rule: but the slothful shall be under tribute... The slothful man roasteth not that which he took in hunting: but the substance of a diligent man is precious" (**Proverbs 12:24; 27**).

- Proverbs 21:25-26 and Proverbs 24:30-34.
- 11. What does heaviness [anxiety] in one's heart do?

"Heaviness in the heart of man maketh it stoop: but a good word maketh it glad" (**Proverbs 12:25**).

• Psalms 38:6, Proverbs 15:13, Proverbs 17:22, Proverbs 18:14, and Philippians 4:6-7.

- 12. Regardless of how righteous we are, what do we need to be cautious of?

 Being seduced by the way of the wicked: "The righteous is more excellent than his neighbour: but the way of the wicked seduceth them" (Proverbs 12:26).
 - Psalms 119:115, Proverbs 9:6, Proverbs 13:20, I Corinthians 15:33, and I Thessalonians 5:22.
- 13. What is in the way of righteousness?

Life, not death (spiritually speaking): "In the way of righteousness is life; and in the pathway thereof there is no death" (**Proverbs 12:28**).

• Ezekiel 18:9, Ezekiel 18:20-23, John 5:28-29, Romans 6:22-23, and Jude 21.
