## **Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths**

Part 142 – A Wise Woman Builds Her House Through What Seems Right (Proverbs 14:1-12)

- 1. What is the difference between a wise woman and a foolish woman?
  - "Every wise woman buildeth her house: but the foolish plucketh it down with her hands" (**Proverbs 14:1**).
  - \* Wise woman that builds the house (Ruth 4:9-12, Proverbs 24:3-4, Proverbs 31:10-31, II Timothy 1:5, and Titus 2:3-5).
  - \* Foolish woman (I Kings 21:25, Proverbs 19:13, Proverbs 21:9, and Proverbs 21:19).
- 2. What is the difference between one who walks in uprightness and one that is perverse in his ways?
  - "He that walketh in his uprightness feareth the LORD: but he that is perverse in his ways despiseth him" (**Proverbs 14:2**).
  - \* Walking in the fear of the Lord to be upright (**Deuteronomy 8:6**, **Deuteronomy 13:4**, **Job 1:1**, **Psalms 112:1**, **Ecclesiastes 12:13**, **Malachi 2:1-6**, **Acts 9:31**, and **Acts 10:34-35**).
  - \* Those who do not fear (**Jeremiah 44:10**), but rather despise God (**Malachi 1:6-10** and **Luke 10:16**).
- 3. What are some lessons we can learn from Proverbs 14:3?
  - "In the mouth of the foolish is a rod of pride: but the lips of the wise shall preserve them" (**Proverbs 14:3**).
  - \* The foolish have a rod of pride in the mouths (**Proverbs 8:13**), which shall be cut off (**Psalms 12:3**).
  - Pride leads to destruction (**Proverbs 16:18**, **Proverbs 11:2**, **Proverbs 18:12**, **Isaiah 2:11-12**, **James 4:6**, and **I John 2:16**).
  - \* The lips of the wise lead to being preserved (**Proverbs 12:6** and **Matthew 12:34-37**).
- 4. If one who needed oxen to accomplish work wanted to keep the crib [stall] clean by having no oxen, would they accomplish much work by having no oxen?
  - No: "Where no oxen are, the crib is clean: but much increase is by the strength of the ox" (**Proverbs 14:4**).
  - \* Don't get rid of a necessary tool just to keep something clean. Oxen were valuable to get work done in those days (cf. **Deuteronomy 22:10**).

5. Is every witness always telling the truth?

No: "A faithful witness will not lie: but a false witness will utter lies" (Proverbs 14:5).

- \* We should be faithful witnesses, in that we will <u>NOT</u> lie (I Kings 22:12-14, Proverbs 13:5, Romans 9:1, and Colossians 3:9).
- \* The only thing you can count on a false witness for is that they will lie (**Psalms 35:11**, **Proverbs 17:4**, and **I John 2:4**).
- 6. What type of person seeks wisdom, but cannot find it?

A scorner [mocker]: "<u>A scorner seeketh wisdom, and findeth it not</u>: but knowledge is easy unto him that understandeth" (**Proverbs 14:6**).

- \* Commentary on this: **Proverbs 1:22**, **Proverbs 13:1**, and **Jude 18**.
- \* Knowledge is easy to those who have understanding (**Proverbs 17:24**, **Proverbs 19:25**, **Proverbs 28:5**, and **Ephesians 5:17**).
- 7. Should we keep company with those who are foolish?

No: "Go from the presence of a foolish man, when thou perceivest not in him the lips of knowledge" (**Proverbs 14:7**).

- \* Proverbs 9:6, Proverbs 13:20, Proverbs 19:27, Jeremiah 15:17, I Corinthians 15:33, and Ephesians 5:11.
- 8. Does a prudent, thoughtful individual understand his or her way?

Yes: "The wisdom of the prudent is to understand his way: but the folly of fools is deceit" (**Proverbs 14:8**).

- \* We should have an understanding of "the way" in which we live and walk (**Psalms 111:10** and **Proverbs 15:24**).
- \* The fool has deceived himself / herself into thinking all is well, when it is not (Luke 12:16-21 and James 1:22).
- 9. Do fools take sin very seriously?

No: "Fools make a mock at sin: but among the righteous there is favour" (**Proverbs** 14:9).

- \* Job 15:16, Proverbs 1:22, Proverbs 10:23, Proverbs 15:21, Proverbs 30:20, and Romans 1:28-32.
- 10. Are there things we face internally that others cannot meddle in?

Yes: "The heart knoweth his own bitterness; and a stranger doth not intermeddle with his joy" (**Proverbs 14:10**).

- \* We have internal sorrows at times (Job 10:1, Proverbs 15:13, Jeremiah 8:18, Ezekiel 3:14, John 12:27, and Romans 9:1-3).
- \* We have internal joy at times (Jeremiah 15:16 and II Corinthians 7:13).
- \* There are times wherein we might really want to help one facing tough times (Romans 12:15 and Galatians 6:2), but they may have to bear it alone (Luke 9:23, II Corinthians 12:10, and Galatians 6:5).
- 11. What is the end of the house of the wicked?

"The house of the wicked shall be overthrown: but the tabernacle of the upright shall flourish" (**Proverbs 14:11**).

- \* **Proverbs 21:12**
- 12. Is it good to trust in that which seems right?

No: "There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death" (Proverbs 14:12).

\* Proverbs 16:25, Proverbs 3:5-7, Proverbs 21:2, Isaiah 5:21, Jeremiah 17:9, Hosea 13:2, II Samuel 7:1-7, and Mark 7:1-9.
