## Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 144 – Profit In Labor Through Favor Toward A Wise Servant (Proverbs 14:23-35)

1. Is it better to be a worker or a talker who doesn't get things done?

Be a worker or suffer penury [poverty]: "In all labour there is profit: but the talk of the lips tendeth only to penury" (**Proverbs 14:23**).

- \* This applies carnally (**Proverbs 12:24** and **II Thessalonians 3:7-13**).
- \* It also applies spiritually (Matthew 25:14-30, John 6:27, I Corinthians 15:58, and Hebrews 6:10-12).
- 2. Rather than a crown of true riches (i.e. Proverbs 8:18 and Revelation 2:9; 3:18), what do fools reap?

Foolishness: "The crown of the wise is their riches: but the foolishness of fools is folly" (**Proverbs 14:24**).

- \* First off, we know the riches of the wise are not earthly treasures because Solomon has already shown the foolishness of trusting in earthly riches (**Proverbs 11:28** and **Proverbs 13:7-8**).
- \* Fools produce folly (**Proverbs 13:16**, **Proverbs 15:21**, **Proverbs 17:12**, and **Proverbs 26:11**).
- 3. Can a true witness be helpful?

Yes: "A true witness delivereth souls: but a deceitful witness speaketh lies" (**Proverbs** 14:25).

- \* Think about how much we benefit from the Apostles being eyewitnesses of our Savior and His works (Acts 2:32, Acts 3:15, and Acts 26:22).
- \* On the other hand, false witnesses can cause much harm (**Psalms 35:11**, **Proverbs 25:18**, **Matthew 26:59-66**, and **Acts 6:9-13**).
- 4. Is it profitable to fear the Lord?

Yes, of course: "(26) <u>In the fear of the LORD is strong confidence</u>: and his children shall have a place of refuge. (27) <u>The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, to depart from</u> the snares of death" (**Proverbs 14:26-27**).

- \* Psalms 112:1, Proverbs 3:7-8, Proverbs 19:23, and Philippians 2:12.
- 5. Does a king want to be among a multitude of people?

Yes: "In the multitude of people is the king's honour: but in the want of people is the destruction of the prince" (Proverbs 14:28; cf. I Kings 4:20-21).

6. Is it good if one is easily provoked to a point of wrath?

No: "He that is slow to wrath is of great understanding: but he that is hasty of spirit exalteth folly" (**Proverbs 14:29**).

- \* Proverbs 14:17, Proverbs 15:18, Proverbs 16:32, Ephesians 4:26, Ephesians 4:31, and James 1:19-20.
- 7. Is envy a good thing?

No: "A sound heart is the life of the flesh: but envy the rottenness of the bones" (**Proverbs 4:30**).

- \* A sound heart is good (**Proverbs 4:23**).
- \* Envy is destructive (Job 5:2, Proverbs 27:4, Matthew 26:17-18, Acts 17:1-5, Romans 13:13, and James 3:16).
- 8. Is it pleasing to God for us to oppress the poor?

No: "He that oppresseth the poor reproacheth his Maker: but he that honoureth him hath mercy on the poor" (**Proverbs 14:31**).

- \* Psalms 41:1, Proverbs 22:16, Proverbs 22:22-23, Zechariah 7:10, and Luke 6:20.
- \* The Lord is the maker of all (**Proverbs 22:2**).
- 9. What do the righteous have hope in?

Death either of self or the wicked (I am not sure which this verse is discussing, but both are true): "The wicked is driven away in his wickedness: but the righteous hath hope in his death" (**Proverbs 14:32**).

- \* This point could be true in the righteous having hope in the death of the wicked (**Proverbs 11:10** and **Proverbs 28:28**).
- \* This point could also be true in the righteous having hope in his own death (**Psalms 116:15** and **Philippians 1:21**).
- 10. Where does wisdom rest?

"Wisdom resteth in the heart of him that hath understanding: but that which is in the midst of fools is made known" (Proverbs 14:33).

- \* Our hearts are places wherein understanding and wisdom meet together (**Proverbs 2:2** and **Colossians 3:16**).
- \*Thus, it is imperative to seek understanding with all of our hearts (**Proverbs** 15:14).

11. Are nations affected by the actions of the people therein?

Yes, good comes to a nation through righteous people while sin brings reproach: "Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people" (**Proverbs** 14:34).

- \* "Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD; and the people whom he hath chosen for his own inheritance" (Psalms 33:12).
- \* Also: "Take away the wicked from before the king, and his throne shall be established in righteousness" (**Proverbs 25:5**).
- 12. To obtain favor of a king, what kind of servant does one want to be?

  A wise servant: "The king's favour is toward <u>a wise servant</u>: but his wrath is against him that causeth shame" (**Proverbs 14:35**).

## \* I Samuel 18:5.

- \* The only downside to being a wise servant is if the king is envious and always worrying about being overthrown, though a wise servant would never do such a thing (i.e. Saul; **I Samuel 18:12**).
- \* These things matter for this reason: "The king's wrath is as the roaring of a lion; but his favour is as dew upon the grass" (**Proverbs 19:12**).
- \* Spiritually, Christ is our KING (**John 18:36-37**). The application to us spiritually is that we want to be wise servants (**Matthew 24:45-51**).
