## **Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths**

Part 145 – A Soft Answer Through God Knows The Hearts Of Men (Proverbs 15:1-11)

1. Can your words cause others to become angry?

Yes: "A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger" (**Proverbs** 15:1).

- \* In bad situations, we have to contain ourselves (**Proverbs 14:17**, **Proverbs 15:18**, **Proverbs 16:32**, **Ecclesiastes 7:9**, and **James 1:19-20**).
- \* We are the peace seekers (Psalms 34:14 and I Peter 3:10-11) and peacemakers (Romans 14:19, Hebrews 12:14, and James 3:18).
- \* One should not "stir the pot" (**Proverbs 29:22**).
- \* It MUST be stated, this does not mean we "back up" or speak softly when it comes to teaching or standing for the truth (Matthew 10:34-37, Luke 11:45-54, Acts 18:4-6, I Corinthians 2:1-5, II Corinthians 3:12, Philippians 1:17, and Jude 3-4).
- 2. Is it possible to use knowledge incorrectly?

Yes, by implication if you can use knowledge aright then you can use it incorrectly: "The tongue of the wise useth knowledge aright: but the mouth of fools poureth out foolishness" (**Proverbs 15:2**).

- \* Proverbs 16:23, Isaiah 50:4, and I Corinthians 10:23.
- \* There is often a time to back away from speaking truth (Matthew 7:6, Matthew 10:14, I Corinthians 3:1-3, and Hebrews 5:11).
- \* Consider that we can wrongly divide the word of truth (II Timothy 2:15).
- 3. Does the Lord see everything?

Yes: "The eyes of the LORD are in every place, beholding the evil and the good" (**Proverbs 15:3**).

- \* II Chronicles 16:9, Proverbs 5:21, Jeremiah 16:17, Jeremiah 23:24, Hosea 7:2, and Hebrews 4:13.
- \* He sees more than what's on the outside too. We'll discuss this when we get to verse 11.
- 4. What benefit is there to having a wholesome tongue rather than having perverseness come from your mouth?

"A wholesome tongue is a tree of life: but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit" (**Proverbs 15:4**).

- \* "Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones" (**Proverbs 16:24**).
- \* When looking to define wholesome words, we find that the words of Christ are wholesome (I Timothy 6:3).
- \* On the other hand, perverse words can devour one (**Psalms 52:2-4**).
- 5. What type of person despises his father's instruction?
  - "A fool despiseth his father's instruction: but he that regardeth reproof is prudent" (**Proverbs 15:5**).
  - \* **Proverbs 1:8**, **Proverbs 13:1**, and **Proverbs 19:20**.
- 6. What can be found in the house of the wise?
  - "In the house of the righteous is much treasure: but in the revenues of the wicked is trouble" (**Proverbs 15:6**).
  - \* Remember, we are not talking about physical wealth when we are talking about treasure that is good (**Proverbs 15:16**, **Proverbs 23:4-5**, **Matthew 6:19-21**, **Luke 6:45**, **Colossians 2:1-3**, **Hebrews 11:24-26**, and **Revelation 3:17-18**).
  - \* The revenues [fruit] of the wicked are trouble (**Proverbs 10:16** and **Matthew 7:17**).
- 7. What do the lips of the wise disperse?

The lips of the wise disperse [spread] knowledge: "The lips of the wise disperse knowledge: but the heart of the foolish doeth not so" (**Proverbs 15:7**).

- \* Psalms 37:30, Psalms 51:13, Psalms 71:15-17, Ecclesiastes 12:9-10, Malachi 2:7, and Colossians 1:10).
- 8. Does the Lord accept acts of worship from the wicked?

No: "The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the LORD: but the prayer of the upright is his delight" (**Proverbs 15:8**).

- \* Proverbs 21:27, Proverbs 28:9, Isaiah 1:10-16, Isaiah 66:2-4, Jeremiah 6:19-20, Amos 5:21-24, Matthew 23:14, Mark 7:7-9, I Timothy 2:8, and I Peter 3:12.
- 9. Is God indifferent in His thinking about the way of the wicked?

No: "The way of the wicked is an abomination unto the LORD: but he loveth him that followeth after righteousness" (**Proverbs 15:9**).

\* **Isaiah 55:7** and **Nahum 1:3**.

## 10. Will those who hate correction be saved?

No: "Correction is grievous unto him that forsaketh the way: and <u>he that hateth</u> <u>reproof shall die</u>" (**Proverbs 15:10**).

- \* Those who choose to err do not like to be corrected (I Kings 22:8, John 3:19-21, and John 7:7).
- \* Those who reject correction hate their own souls (**Proverbs 15:31-32**).

## 11. Does the Lord know what is in the hearts of men?

Yes: "Hell and destruction are before the LORD: how much more then the hearts of the children of men" (**Proverbs 15:11**)?

\* I Samuel 16:7, I Chronicles 28:9, Psalms 44:21, Jeremiah 11:20, Jeremiah 17:10, John 2:24-25, Romans 8:27, and I John 3:20.
