Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 149 – A King Is To Be Righteous Through Understanding Brings Life (Proverbs 16:12-22)

1. Should a king find delight in committing wickedness?

No: "It is an abomination to kings to commit wickedness: for the throne is established by righteousness" (**Proverbs 16:12**).

- Proverbs 20:28, Proverbs 25:5, and Proverbs 29:14.
- 2. What kind of speech do righteous kings love?

"Righteous lips are the delight of kings; and they love him that speaketh right" (**Proverbs 16:13**).

- Proverbs 14:35 and Proverbs 22:11.
- 3. Does a wise man seek to cause the king to be angry with him?

No: "The wrath of a king is as messengers of death: but <u>a wise man will pacify it</u>" (**Proverbs 16:14**).

- Proverbs 19:12, Proverbs 20:2, Ecclesiastes 8:4, and Daniel 5:18-19.
- Christians are told to honor the king (I Peter 2:17).
- 4. If one found his or her self in the favor of the king, was that a good thing?

 Yes, like the cloud of the latter rain [spring rain]: "In the light of the king's countenance is life; and his favour is as a cloud of the latter rain" (**Proverbs 16:15**).
 - The latter rain is the spring rain (cf. **Job 29:23-24** and **Zechariah 10:1**).
- 5. How valuable are wisdom and understanding?

More than gold and silver: "How much better is it to get wisdom than gold! and to get understanding rather to be chosen than silver" (**Proverbs 16:16**)!

- Proverbs 4:7, Proverbs 8:10-11, and Ecclesiastes 7:12.
- Earthly treasures cannot save anyone (Psalms 49:6-10, Matthew 16:26, Luke 12:13-21, and Revelation 3:17-19).
- Wisdom saves (**Proverbs 24:14** and **Isaiah 33:6**).
- We'll take more about understanding in question 11 (verse 22).
- 6. What is the highway of the upright?

Departing from evil: "The highway of the upright is to depart from evil: he that keepeth his way preserveth his soul" (**Proverbs 16:17**).

 Job 28:28, Psalms 34:13-15, Proverbs 4:24-27, II Corinthians 7:1, and II Timothy 2:19. 7. Is it better to be humble or to be proud and haughty?

We'd better be humble: "(18) Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall. (19) Better it is to be of an humble spirit with the lowly, than to divide the spoil with the proud" (**Proverbs 16:18-19**).

- Pride doesn't help anyone (**Proverbs 11:12**, **Proverbs 15:25**, **Proverbs 16:5**, **Proverbs 21:4**, **Proverbs 29:23**, **I Peter 5:5**, and **I John 2:16-17**).
- A haughty spirit is not good either (II Samuel 22:28, Proverbs 18:12, and Isaiah 2:11-12).
- The Lord has respect unto the lowly (**Psalms 138:6** and **Isaiah 57:15**).
- The humble are exalted while the exalted will be abased (Matthew 23:12 and Luke 18:9-14).
- 8. How do you have to handle a matter to find good?

"He that handleth a matter <u>wisely</u> shall find good..." (**Proverbs 16:20**).

- Proverbs 24:3-5
- 9. In whom should you trust to find happiness? "...and whoso trusteth in the LORD, happy is he" (**Proverbs 16:20**).

• Psalms 64:10 and Psalms 146:5.

10. What kind of heart must one have to be called prudent [Strong's #995; "one of understanding; perceptive"]?

"The wise in heart shall be called prudent: and the sweetness of the lips increaseth learning" (**Proverbs 16:21**).

- Proverbs 10:8, Proverbs 16:23, Proverbs 18:15, and Ecclesiastes 8:5.
- 11. Would you rather be one of understanding or one who hears the instruction of fools?

 One of understanding, for such brings life: "Understanding is a wellspring of life unto him that hath it: but the instruction of fools is folly" (Proverbs 16:22).
 - Understanding is required for salvation (Matthew 13:19 and Ephesians 5:17).
 - Listening to a fool (cf. **Ecclesiastes 7:5**) causes you to fall (**Matthew 15:14**).
