Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 150 – The Heart Of The Wise Through The Casting Of Lots (Proverbs 16:23-33)

1. What does the heart of the wise do?

"The heart of the wise teacheth his mouth, and addeth learning to his lips" (**Proverbs** 16:23).

- The heart of the wise (**Proverbs 10:8**, **Ecclesiastes 7:4**, and **Ecclesiastes 8:5**).
- Also the heart of the foolish (**Proverbs 15:7**).
- The mouth (**Psalms 37:30-31**, **Proverbs 10:14**, and **Proverbs 15:2**).
- The lips (Proverbs 22:17-18 and Ecclesiastes 10:12).
- The heart and our mouths are connected (Matthew 12:34-37 and Luke 6:45).
- 2. Are pleasant words good for us to hear?

Yes, but with caution (more on this in a moment): "Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones" (**Proverbs 16:24**).

- Proverbs 25:11-12, Proverbs 25:25, and Proverbs 27:9.
- The caution is that people often want to hear pleasant words when they are in sin. This is not when pleasant words are profitable (Ecclesiastes 7:5, Proverbs 27:5-6, II Timothy 4:2, and Revelation 3:19).
- 3. Is the way that seems right always the right way to choose?

No: "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death" (Proverbs 16:25).

- Proverbs 3:5-7, Proverbs 12:15, Proverbs 14:12, Proverbs 14:16, Proverbs 16:2, Proverbs 16:25, Proverbs 20:24, Proverbs 21:2, Proverbs 28:26, Proverbs 30:12, Isaiah 5:21, Isaiah 55:7-9, Jeremiah 10:23, Jeremiah 17:9, Hosea 13:2, II Corinthians 10:12, II Corinthians 10:18, and Galatians 6:3.
- 4. What is one motivation for a man to labor?

To feed himself: "He that laboureth laboureth for himself; for his mouth craveth it of him" (**Proverbs 16:26**).

- Ecclesiastes 6:7, I Thessalonians 4:11-12, and II Thessalonians 3:10.
- 5. What does an ungodly man dig up?

Evil: "An ungodly man diggeth up evil: and in his lips there is as a burning fire" (**Proverbs 16:27**).

• The point is, an evil man works hard at bringing about evil (**Isaiah 5:18**).

6. What does a froward man and a whisperer do?

"A froward [perverse] man soweth strife: and a whisperer separateth chief friends" (**Proverbs 16:28**).

- Sowing of strife (**Proverbs 6:14**, **Proverbs 29:22**, **Philippians 2:3**, and **James 3:16**).
- Whispering (**Proverbs 26:20-22**).
- 7. What kind of man entices his neighbor?

"A violent man enticeth his neighbour, and leadeth him into the way that is not good" (**Proverbs 16:29**; cf. **Proverbs 29:5**).

- We should love our neighbors (Galatians 5:14 and James 2:8), not seek to entice them (Proverbs 14:21 and Proverbs 24:28).
- If we find ourselves being enticed, we should not go with that person (**Proverbs** 1:10).
- 8. In the context of the violent man, what does he do when he shuts his eyes?

 "He shutteth his eyes to devise froward things: moving his lips he bringeth evil to pass"

 (Proverbs 16:30).
 - No matter what an evil man is doing, he's working something that is not good (**Proverbs 6:12-14**).
- 9. When is the hoary [grayish-white] head a crown of glory?

 "The hoary head is a crown of glory, if it be found in the way of righteousness"

 (Proverbs 16:31).
 - Old age does not always mean wisdom or righteousness (**Job 32:1-18**), but being aged is not an ugly thing (**Proverbs 20:29**).
- 10. How good is it to be able to control one's anger?

"He that is slow to anger is better than the mighty; and he that ruleth his spirit than he that taketh a city" (**Proverbs 16:32**).

- Proverbs 14:17, Proverbs 14:29, Proverbs 15:18, Proverbs 25:28, and James 1:19-20.
- 11. When a lot was cast, was it chance that brought about the decision or was the disposing [verdict; decision] of the Lord?

"The lot is cast into the lap; but the whole disposing thereof is of the LORD" (**Proverbs** 16:33).

• Lots often showed the Lord's will (**Joshua 18:6-10**, **I Samuel 14:37-46**, and **Acts 1:15-26**).
