## **Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths**

Part 152 – The Wise Receive Reproof Through Those Void Of Understanding (Proverbs 17:10-18)

- 1. Does a wise man gain more from reproof than a fool would gain from a serious beating? Yes: "A reproof entereth more into a wise man than an hundred stripes into a fool" (Proverbs 17:10).
  - Wise individuals want to be corrected (**Proverbs 9:8-9**, **Proverbs 15:31**, and **Hebrews 12:5**; cf. **II Timothy 3:15-17**).
  - A fool just doesn't learn no matter what you do to them (**Proverbs 15:5**, **Proverbs 27:22**, **Isaiah 1:5**, **Jeremiah 2:30**, and **Jeremiah 5:3**).
- 2. Are evil people rebellious?

Yes: "An evil man seeketh only rebellion: therefore a cruel messenger shall be sent against him" (Proverbs 17:11).

- Rebellion is departing from God's word (Ezekiel 20:13 and Daniel 9:5).
- 3. How bad is it for a fool to meet his folly [foolishness; lack of good sense]?

  Bad, as is identified by the comparison drawn: "Let a bear robbed of her whelps meet a man, rather than a fool in his folly" (Proverbs 17:12).
  - A fool returning to his folly or meeting his folly is just a sure situation of apostasy (**Proverbs 5:23**).
  - The illustration of a bear meeting a man in defense of her young is powerful (**Hosea 13:8**).
- 4. Is it good for a person to reward evil for good?

No, for evil shall not depart from their house: "Whoso rewardeth evil for good, evil shall not depart from his house" (Proverbs 17:13).

- Psalms 38:20 and Psalms 109:3-17; cf. Matthew 27:24-25.
- 5. Is it good to allow strife to begin?

No, it's like flood waters: "The beginning of strife is as when one letteth out water: therefore leave off contention, before it be meddled with" (Proverbs 17:14).

- Strife grows: **Proverbs 26:21**
- Therefore, steer clear of contention (**Proverbs 20:3**).

- 6. How does the Lord view those who justify the wicked and/or condemn the just?

  They both are an abomination to Him: "He that justifieth the wicked, and he that condemneth the just, even they both are abomination to the LORD" (Proverbs 17:15).
  - Deuteronomy 25:1, Isaiah 5:20; 23, Malachi 2:17, and Luke 23:18-25.
- 7. Does it make any sense for a fool to appear as though he's trying to obtain wisdom when his heart is not set on it?

No: "Wherefore is there a price in the hand of a fool to get wisdom, seeing he hath no heart to it" (**Proverbs 17:16**)?

- The heart of a fool is not set on gaining knowledge from God (Psalms 14:1, Proverbs 12:23, Proverbs 15:14, Proverbs 18:2, Proverbs 19:3, and Proverbs 28:26).
- This does not mean one cannot go from being foolish to being a wise servant of God (Titus 3:3).
- Additionally, one who has served God can turn back to foolishness (Galatians 3:1-3).
- 8. What are signs of a true friend and a good brother?

When they're there through the tough times: "A friend loveth at all times, and a brother is born for adversity" (**Proverbs 17:17**).

- I Samuel 18:3; 19:2, Proverbs 18:24, John 15:13-14, and Galatians 6:2.
- 9. Does a wise man become a surety [one taking responsibility for the debt of another] for another?

No: "A man void of understanding striketh hands, and becometh surety in the presence of his friend" (Proverbs 17:18).

- See also: Proverbs 6:1-5, Proverbs 11:15-18, and Proverbs 22:26-27.
- If it is a brother in need, we should give rather than lend (Acts 20:35, Romans 15:25-27, and I John 3:15-18).
