Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 158 – Hear Counsel Through Judgment and Stripes For Fools (Proverbs 19:20-29)

1. What do we need to hear and receive to be wise in our latter end?

"<u>Hear counsel, and receive instruction</u>, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end" (**Proverbs 19:20**).

- Proverbs 2:1-9, Proverbs 21:30, and I Corinthians 4:6.
- We can receive instruction just from things like observation as well (**Proverbs 24:30-32**).
- Some are just unwilling to receive instruction (Jeremiah 17:21-23 and Jeremiah 32:33).
- 2. Should we put our own counsel in our hearts or should we put the counsel of the Lord in our hearts?

The counsel of the Lord: "There are many devices in a man's heart; <u>nevertheless the</u> counsel of the LORD, that shall stand" (**Proverbs 19:21**).

- The counsel of God stands (Psalms 33:10-11 and Isaiah 46:10; cf. Proverbs 3:5-7).
- We shouldn't trust in our hearts (**Proverbs 28:26**, **Jeremiah 16:12**, and **Jeremiah 17:9**).
- 3. Is kindness something that is desired of man?

Yes: "The desire of a man is his kindness..." (Proverbs 19:22).

- Luke 6:35 and Colossians 3:12.
- 4. Is it better to be poor or to be a liar?

"...and a poor man is better than a liar" (Proverbs 19:22).

- The poor can be saved (Psalms 72:13 and Luke 16:19-31; cf. Proverbs 19:1).
- Liars cannot be saved (Revelation 21:8).
- 5. Is it good to fear the Lord?

Good and necessary: "The fear of the LORD tendeth to life: and he that hath it shall abide satisfied; he shall not be visited with evil" (Proverbs 19:23).

- Psalms 33:18-19, Psalms 34:9-11, Psalms 85:9, Psalms 103:17, Proverbs 14:27,
 Proverbs 15:33, Ecclesiastes 12:13-14, Philippians 2:12, and I Peter 2:17).
- 6. Will slothful [lazy; sluggard] individuals put much food on the table?

 No: "A slothful man hideth his hand in his bosom, and will not so much as bring it to his mouth again" (Proverbs 19:24).
 - Proverbs 19:15, Proverbs 20:4, Proverbs 24:30-34, Proverbs 26:13-16, Ecclesiastes 10:18, and Romans 12:11.

- 7. Can smiting a scorner [mocker] help the simple [naive] learn anything?
 - Sure: "Smite a scorner, and the simple will beware..." (Proverbs 19:25).
 - Deuteronomy 13:6-11 and Proverbs 21:11.
- 8. Do people of understanding receive correction well?

Yes: "...and reprove one that hath understanding, and he will understand knowledge" (**Proverbs 19:25**).

- Proverbs 9:9-10 and Proverbs 17:10.
- 9. What can a child do to bring reproach upon his family?

"He that wasteth his father, and chaseth away his mother, is a son that causeth shame, and bringeth reproach" (Proverbs 19:26).

- Proverbs 10:1, Proverbs 17:21, and Proverbs 17:25.
- 10. What kind of instruction should we NOT listen to?

"Cease, my son, to hear the instruction that causeth to err from the words of knowledge" (**Proverbs 19:27**).

- Psalms 1:1-2, Mark 4:24, Romans 16:17-18, Ephesians 4:14, I Timothy 1:3-7, and I Timothy 6:3-5.
- 11. Does an ungodly witness make a mockery of true judgment?

Yes: "An ungodly witness scorneth judgment: and the mouth of the wicked devoureth iniquity" (Proverbs 19:28).

- I Samuel 8:1-3 and Acts 6:9-15.
- 12. Will a scorner escape judgment?

No: "Judgments are prepared for scorners..." (Proverbs 19:29).

- II Peter 3:1-10.
- 13. For whom are stripes on the back prepared for?

"...and stripes for the back of fools" (Proverbs 19:29).

Proverbs 10:13 and Proverbs 26:3; cf. Proverbs 17:10.
