## **Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths**

Part 168 – Eating With A Ruler Through Applying The Heart (Proverbs 23:1-12)

1. Do we need to be cautious when sitting at a meal with a person in authority?

Yes: "(1) When thou sittest to eat with a ruler, consider diligently what is before thee: (2) And put a knife to thy throat, if thou be a man given to appetite. (3) Be not desirous of his dainties: for they are deceitful meat" (**Proverbs 23:1-3**).

- We cannot be given to appetite (Proverbs 23:21 and Proverbs 25:16) or any thing else carnal (Matthew 8:8-9, Romans 8:13, II Corinthians 7:1, Galatians 5:16-17, and I Peter 2:11), but must practice self-control (Proverbs 16:32, I Corinthians 9:27, Galatians 5:22-23, and II Peter 1:3-11).
- Dainties [delicacy; savory meats] should not be our focus in life to even allow them to become a temptation (John 6:26-27; cf. Matthew 4:4).
- We're supposed to put off the old man with deceitful lusts (Ephesians 4:22).
- We'll discuss more about desiring his dainties because they're deceitful in question 5.
- 2. Should we work hard to be rich?

No: "Labour not to be rich..." (Proverbs 23:4).

- Working, just to be rich, provides many possible temptations (cf. **Proverbs 28:20**).
- Once wealth becomes our goal, and we do things wrong to obtain it, it will be diminished (**Proverbs 13:11**).
- Quick riches are good riches either (**Proverbs 20:21**).
- We need contentment (Philippians 4:10-13).
- Our labor should be to provide for our needs (II Thessalonians 3:10), the needs of our family (I Timothy 5:8), and the work of the Lord (Matthew 6:19-21).
- Having said that, we certainly can enjoy the fruit of our labor in lawful things that we may want (Ecclesiastes 2:24 and I Timothy 6:17), but those things should not be our motivation (I Timothy 6:6-10).
- 3. Should we trust in our own wisdom?

No: "...cease from thine own wisdom" (Proverbs 23:4).

- Proverbs 3:5-7, Isaiah 5:21, Romans 12:16, and I Corinthians 3:18-20.
- 4. Is earthly wealth permanent?

No: "Wilt thou set thine eyes upon that which is not? for riches certainly make themselves wings; they fly away as an eagle toward heaven" (**Proverbs 23:5**).

- Don't set your eyes on earthly wealth (Psalms 119:36-37).
- Riches are temporary (Psalms 49:10, Proverbs 27:24, Ecclesiastes 5:13-14, and Luke 12:13-21).

- 5. Are there people who will act kindly toward us, but their hearts may be against us?

  Yes: "(6) Eat thou not the bread of him that hath an evil eye, neither desire thou his dainty meats: (7) For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he: Eat and drink, saith he to thee; but his heart is not with thee. (8) The morsel which thou hast eaten shalt thou vomit up, and lose thy sweet words" (Proverbs 23:6-8).
  - What people are saying and showing us, can very easily differ from their real motives (Psalms 5:8-9, Proverbs 10:18, Proverbs 20:19, Proverbs 26:17-28, Matthew 23:27-28, and Mark 7:6).
  - "The simple believeth every word: but the prudent man looketh well to his going" (Proverbs 14:15).
- 6. Can we expect a fool to learn wisdom if we share it with him or her?

  No: "Speak not in the ears of a fool: for he will despise the wisdom of thy words" (Proverbs 23:9).
  - Proverbs 9:7-8, Matthew 7:6, Galatians 4:16, II Timothy 2:23, and Titus 3:9-11.
- 7. Is God concerned about rightful ownership of land?

Yes: "(10) Remove not the old landmark; and enter not into the fields of the fatherless: (11) For their redeemer is mighty; he shall plead their cause with thee" (Proverbs 23:10-11).

- We discussed the landmarks in **Proverbs 22:28**. They were not to be moved (**Deuteronomy 19:14; 27:17**).
- The fatherless have been targets of the wicked (**Psalms 94:6**).
- God has long instructed man not to wrong the fatherless (Zechariah 7:10).
- God will plead the cause of the weak who are wronged (Exodus 22:22-24).
- 8. What should we apply our hearts and ears to?

  Instruction and knowledge: "Apply thine heart unto instruction."

Instruction and knowledge: "Apply thine heart unto instruction, and thine ears to the words of knowledge" (Proverbs 23:12).

- Apply your heart to instruction [be willing to be taught] (Proverbs 4:13, Proverbs 5:23, Proverbs 6:23, Proverbs 8:33, Proverbs 10:17, Proverbs 15:32-33, Proverbs 23:23, and II Timothy 3:15-17).
- Give your ears to the words of knowledge (Proverbs 18:15, Proverbs 22:17, Colossians 3:10, and I Timothy 2:4).
