## **Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths**

Part 181 – Rejoicing The Heart Through Honor From Service (Proverbs 27:9-18)

- 1. Like ointment and perfume, what does hearty counsel do for a man?

  Hearty counsel from a friend can rejoice the heart: "Ointment and perfume rejoice the heart: so doth the sweetness of a man's friend by hearty counsel" (Proverbs 27:9).
  - Ointment and perfume's represent gladness (Psalms 45:7-8).
  - Good counsel is great (Proverbs 1:5, Proverbs 19:20, and Proverbs 24:6).
- 2. Should you forsake your friends?

No: "Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not" (Proverbs 27:10).

- Proverbs 18:24, Proverbs 27:5-6, and John 15:13.
- 3. Is it better to depend on a neighbor than a brother who keeps himself at a distance? Yes: "...neither go into thy brother's house in the day of thy calamity: for better is a neighbour that is near than a brother far off" (Proverbs 27:10).
  - Sometimes a brother is not there for you (Genesis 4:1-10, Genesis 27:18-36, Genesis 37:11-36, Jeremiah 9:4, and Mark 13:12).
  - A true friend is always there (**Proverbs 17:17** and **Romans 16:1-4**).
  - The definition of Jesus of true friends and brethren are those who obey God (Matthew 12:46-50 and John 15:14).
- 4. Can the wisdom of a child help the parent defend his or her character?

  Yes: "My son, be wise, and make my heart glad, that I may answer him that reproacheth me" (Proverbs 27:11).
  - We want wise children (Proverbs 10:1, Proverbs 15:20, Proverbs 23:24-25, and Ephesians 6:4).
  - A child's behavior reflects on his or her parent(s) (I Samuel 2:22; 3:12-13, I Timothy 3:4-5, and Titus 1:6).
- 5. What is a difference between a prudent man and a simple [naïve] person?

  "A prudent [caring for the future] man foreseeth the evil, and hideth himself; but the simple pass on, and are punished" (Proverbs 27:12).
  - Proverbs 14:15; 18 and Proverbs 22:3; cf. Proverbs 14:18
  - Wisdom prepares us to be aware (Matthew 10:16).
  - The prudent are aware people (**Proverbs 14:8**).
  - The simple are easy targets (**Proverbs 7:7** and **Proverbs 9:13-18**).
  - Cure for simplicity (Psalms 119:130).

6. If someone is a surety for another, should they be expected to provide something of value for collateral?

Yes: "Take his garment that is surety for a stranger, and take a pledge of him for a strange woman" (Proverbs 27:13; cf. Proverbs 20:16).

- They could take it, but were expected to return it by sundown (Exodus 22:26).
- Overall, don't be a surety (Proverbs 6:1-5, Proverbs 11:15, Proverbs 17:18, and Proverbs 22:26-27).
- 7. Do you want to loudly proclaim praise for a friend early in the morning?

  No: "He that blesseth his friend with a loud voice, rising early in the morning, it shall be counted a curse to him" (Proverbs 27:14).
  - It's not the praise you might receive from another than is wrong (**Proverbs 27:2**), but the one who gives it early in the AM.
- 8. How fun is it to be around a contentious woman?

"A continual dropping in a very rainy day and a contentious woman are alike" (**Proverbs** 27:15).

- Proverbs 19:13, Proverbs 21:9, Proverbs 21:19, and Proverbs 25:24.
- 9. Can you really hide a contentious woman?

No more than you can hide the wind: "(15) A continual dropping in a very rainy day and a contentious woman are alike. (16) Whosoever hideth her hideth the wind, and the ointment of his right hand, which bewrayeth itself" (Proverbs 27:15-16).

- Winds are strong and they are powerful (**Psalms 48:7** and **John 6:18**).
- Something that "bewrayeth" is something that exposes (Matthew 26:73).
- 10. Can one man help another to be sharpened?

Yes: "Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend" (**Proverbs 27:17**).

- I Samuel 23:16, Job 4:3-4, Isaiah 35:3-4, II Corinthians 7:6, and II Timothy 1:16.
- 11. If you diligently work what can you expect?

Fruit from your labor: "Whoso keepeth the fig tree shall eat the fruit thereof: so he that waiteth on his master shall be honoured" (Proverbs 27:18).

- I Corinthians 9:7 and Colossians 3:22-25.
- As we've seen, you reap what you sow (Job 4:8, Job 34:11, Proverbs 12:14, Proverbs 14:14, Proverbs 22:8, Proverbs 24:12, II Corinthians 5:10, and Galatians 6:7-8).
