Having A Basic Understanding of Some Old Testament Truths

Part 183 – Boldness Of The Righteous Through Abominable Prayers (Proverbs 28:1-9)

1. Are wicked people bolder than righteous people?

No: "The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion" (**Proverbs 28:1**).

- Fleeing when no one is really pursuing (Leviticus 26:14-17, Psalms 53:1-5, and Isaiah 7:1-2).
- Boldness of the righteous (Psalms 27:1, Psalms 112:5-7, Daniel 3:1-18, Acts 4:1-13, and Ephesians 6:20).
- 2. Can understanding and knowledge help a nation?

Yes: "For the transgression of a land many are the princes thereof: but by a man of understanding and knowledge the state thereof shall be prolonged" (**Proverbs 28:2**).

- The whole sum of this point is here: **Ecclesiastes 9:13-18**.
- On the contrary point, one sinner does destroy much good (Joshua 7:1-26; cf. Joshua 22:20).
- 3. Are there poor people who will actually oppress other poor people?

Yes: "A poor man that oppresseth the poor is like a sweeping rain which leaveth no food" (**Proverbs 28:3**).

- Matthew 18:23-35 and James 2:1-12.
- 4. What type of person contends with the wicked?

Those that keep the law: "They that forsake the law praise the wicked: but such as keep the law contend with them" (Proverbs 28:4).

- Those who forsake the law praise the wicked (Isaiah 30:9-11, Jeremiah 5:25-31, and II Timothy 4:3-4).
- Those who keep the law contend with the wicked (I Kings 18:17-21, Nehemiah 13:8-11, Acts 17:16-17, Philippians 1:17, Ephesians 5:11, and Jude 3-4).
- Additionally, whom a person listens to tells you much about that person (John 3:19-21 and I John 4:1-6).
- 5. Do evil individuals have the same level of understanding as those who seek the Lord?

 No: "Evil men understand not judgment: but they that seek the LORD understand all things" (Proverbs 28:5).
 - Some don't get it (Psalms 92:6, Proverbs 24:7, Jeremiah 4:22, and I Corinthians 2:14).
 - We should get it (**Proverbs 4:7** and **Ephesians 5:17**).

- 6. Is it better to be poor and upright or to be rich and perverse?

 Poor and upright: "Better is the poor that walketh in his uprightness, than he that is perverse in his ways, though he be rich" (Proverbs 28:6).
 - Proverbs 16:8, Proverbs 19:1, Proverbs 28:18, Luke 6:20, and Luke 16:19-31.
- 7. What kind of child is wise?

Obedient ones: "Whoso keepeth the law is a wise son: but he that is a companion of riotous men shameth his father" (**Proverbs 28:7**).

- II Timothy 3:15.
- But, the companion of fools brings shame (**Proverbs 1:11-19**, **Proverbs 13:20**, **Proverbs 23:19-22**, and **I Corinthians 15:33**).
- 8. Do crooks end up keeping their profits?

Nope, eventually someone will get those funds and use them to help others: "He that by usury and unjust gain increaseth his substance, he shall gather it for him that will pity the poor" (Proverbs 28:8).

- That person who takes advantage of the financial situations of others shall not be unpunished (Ezekiel 18:12-13).
- One day, a person who pity's the poor will have those funds and then good will come of it (**Proverbs 19:17**).
- 9. What type of person does God consider the prayers of to be an abomination?

 Those who refuse the truth: "He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination" (Proverbs 28:9).
 - Psalms 66:18, Proverbs 15:8, Proverbs 15:29, Isaiah 59:1-3, John 9:31, and I Peter 3:12.
