Peradventure There Be Fifty Righteous

I. Introduction:

A. As Christians we are aware that the world is a place of wickedness (**I John 5:19**).

1. We know there is a course of this world (**Ephesians 2:1-5**) that we cannot conform to (**Romans 12:1-3**).

2. We are thankful that the Lord has delivered us from the system of this world and has granted us citizenship above (**Galatians 1:1-4** and **Colossians 1:12-14**).

B. There have been times wherein finding righteous people has been very difficult, even seemingly impossible (**Psalms 14:1-7** [also **Psalms 53:1-6**]). *We know there's a remnant, but sometimes they are hard to find (**Romans 11:1-5**).

1. You can see man's frustration in those times (**Deuteronomy 9:24**, **Psalms 26:4-5**, and **Jeremiah 13:15-17**).

2. You can see God's frustration in those times (**Jeremiah 2:12-13** and **Jeremiah 5:1-13**).

- II. Body: What About Abraham's Mindset (Genesis 18:17-19:29; cf. Romans 15:4)?
 - A. What is God's ultimate will with mankind (Ezekiel 18:20-32 and II Peter 3:9)?
 - 1. Think about what God takes pleasure in (Psalms 147:11).
 - 2. Think about what God delights in (Micah 7:18-20; cf. Luke 6:36).

3. Think about the reaction in Heaven when conversion takes place (Luke 15:1-32).

B. Have you thought about your role as the "salt of the earth" (Matthew 5:13)?

1. If we were all alive in the days of Abraham, in Sodom, would

examination of us have led to the preservation of Sodom (Isaiah 65:8)?

2. What if we're not living up to being the salt of the earth (Luke 14:34-35)?

C. Remember, the world is not worse now than ever before (**Ecclesiastes 1:9** and **Romans 1:16-32**).

1. Do you think the murdering of innocent, as we have recently seen in schools, has only happened now (**Proverbs 1:8-19** and **Acts 2:22-23**)?

2. Do you think people just now, in our day, are the only generations that have oppressed the defenseless (**Ezekiel 22:7** and **Malachi 3:5**)?

3. Senseless murders are not new (James 5:6).

4. Insane religious practices are not new (Jeremiah 32:33-35).

5. Listen, even those who have done the unthinkable can be saved (Acts

3:14-19 and I Timothy 1:12-16; [cf. Acts 22:4 and Acts 26:9-11]).

6. Some of us would do well to remember our sinful pasts like we see revealed about some saints in the past (**I Corinthians 6:9-11** and **Colossians 1:21**).

7. Not allowing our frustrations with the world to keep us from caring about trying to save those who are lost (**Matthew 5:43-48**).

D. Remember, sometimes things have to get really bad for people to desire to look to God (**Judges 3:7-30** and **Lamentations 5:7-22**).

1. They have to come to realize where to find salvation, hope, and peace (Lamentations 3:26, Colossians 3:15, I Thessalonians 5:9, and I Peter 1:17-21).

2. If we don't step in, what happened in Abraham's days will ultimately be what happens to sinners in the end (**Jude 1:7**).

- 3. Listen, few will be saved (Matthew 7:13-14 and Luke 13:23-24).
- 4. Having said that, don't contribute to the loss of any (Matthew 23:13).
