## Proverbs 17:24

## I. Introduction:

- A. What God wants for mankind is not impossible or even hard to find (**Deuteronomy 30:11-20** and **Romans 10:5-13**).
  - 1. The problem has often been that man wants to seek after everything but that which God wants for us (**Isaiah 55:1-7**).
  - 2. That problem continued in the first century (**Philippians 2:21**) and is not set to change for the better in the future (**II Timothy 3:13**, **II Peter 3:3**, and **Jude 1:17-18**).
- B. The question though comes to us. Are we, whom are in Christ Jesus, going to be distracted (**Galatians 5:16-17**, **Galatians 5:24**, and **I Peter 2:11**)?
  - 1. Are we hungry and thirsty for the right things (Matthew 5:6)?
  - 2. Think about how Jesus taught His disciples in regard to being focused on spiritual things (Matthew 6:19-34).
- II. Body: "Wisdom is before him that hath understanding; but the eyes of a fool are in the ends of the earth" (Proverbs 17:24).
  - A. Looking at some of the terms of our study:
    - 1. "Wisdom": "Wisdom (in a good sense): skilful, wisdom, wisely, wit..." (Strong's # 149). Cf. **Proverbs 1:1-7**
    - 2. The term translated "understanding" is very broad. The Hebrew term appears@ 2109 times in the O.T. It is most often translated "before" (1137 times) and face (390 times). Therefore, the idea is that wisdom is in front of the reader.
    - 3. "Fool": "properly, fat, i.e. (figuratively) stupid or silly: fool(-ish). Fool, stupid fellow, dullard, simpleton, arrogant one" (Strong's # 3684). Cf. **Psalms 49:10**, **Proverbs 3:35**, **Proverbs 13:20**, **Proverbs 15:14**, etc.
  - B. Godly wisdom is attainable (**Proverbs 3:13**, **Proverbs 4:5-7**, and **Proverbs 19:8**).
    - 1. There is a difference between godly wisdom and worldly wisdom (I Corinthians 1:18-31 and I Corinthians 3:18-19).
    - 2. For us today, we can obtain wisdom through the written word of God which is right in front of us (I Corinthians 2:1-16, Colossians 3:16, and II Timothy 3:15-17).
    - 3. For us today, correction is a source of wisdom (**Proverbs 29:15**).
    - 4. For us today, things around us can provide us with wisdom (**Proverbs 6:6-11**).
    - 5. For us today, wisdom is obtained through instruction (**Proverbs 8:33**, **Proverbs 9:9**, **Proverbs 19:20**, and **Colossians 1:28**).
    - 6. For us today, wisdom is obtained through observation of the failures of others (**Proverbs 21:12**).

- 7. Once found, wisdom is stored up inside of the heart of those that find it (**Proverbs 14:33**).
- C. The fool just doesn't see clearly or stay focused on the right things (Ecclesiastes 2:14).
  - 1. Fools just keep feeding on foolishness (**Proverbs 15:14**).
  - 2. While the instruction is to invest in wisdom (**Proverbs 23:23**), such an investment doesn't make any sense for a fool (**Proverbs 17:16**).
  - 3. What does God tell us about the carnally focused eyes of a man (**Proverbs 27:20**)?
  - 4. Are your eyes set on things temporary (Proverbs 23:5)?
  - 5. Is eternal life enough for you, me, us; as it was for the faithful of the past who didn't even know what we know (**Hebrews 11:8-16**; cf. **I Peter 1:1-12**)?
- D. Where should our attention be focused (**Colossians 3:1-4** and **Hebrews 13:14**)?
  - 1. Our treasure hunt (Matthew 13:44-46).
  - 2. What have we come to (Hebrews 12:22-23; 12:28)?
  - 3. What should we long for (Psalms 119:166-167 and Psalms 119:174)?
  - 4. Yet, when the world comes calling what is the price those seeking more than Heaven will settle for (**Matthew 16:24-27**)?
- III. Conclusion: Ecclesiastes 6:7-9
