I. Introduction:

- A. Regardless of the reception of such, the word of God is to be boldly proclaimed (**I Thessalonians 2:2**).
 - 1. Some might perceive bold teaching as ignorance (**Acts 4:13**).
 - 2. Some won't listen (**Acts 19:8-10**).
- B. If reception becomes the concern, the watered down word of God will be ineffective in SAVING lost souls (**I Corinthians 1:17-21**).
 - 1. There is no greater love than Jesus showed (**John 15:13**).
 - 2. Yet, Jesus was offensive and unapologetic for it (**Matthew 15:1-14**).

II. Body: **Mark 6:7-29**

- A. There was no greater prophet than John (**Luke 7:28**).
 - 1. John was led by the Holy Spirit (**Luke 1:13-15**).
 - 2. John came preparing they way for Jesus (**Luke 3:1-10**).
 - 3. John's preaching marked the beginning of the end of the Law and prophets of old (**Luke 16:16**).
- B. Herodias had a quarrel against John because he spoke against her marriage to Herod (**Leviticus 20:21**).
 - 1. Jesus certainly didn't loosen the marriage law (**Matthew 5:31-32**).
 - 2. This was/is a struggle for many to accept (**Matthew 19:1-12**).
- C. Why couldn't John just "leave it alone" as many would say (**Acts 20:26-27**)?
 - 1. There are those that love preaching unless preaching turns into meddling. Teaching is needs based (**Luke 10:38-42** and **Jude 1:3-4**).
 - 2. The Gospel can only save those that believe and belief is action (**Romans 1:16-17** and **James 1:19-25**).
 - 3. Sadly, such teaching causes one to have enemies (**John 3:19-21** and **Galatians 4:16**).
- D. Did you notice that Herod feared John, valued John's character, and did many of the things John said (**Mark 6:20**)?
 - 1. Doesn't **Ezekiel 33:30-33** come to mind here?
 - 2. Knowing the truth does no good if you don't do it (**John 8:31-32** and **Romans 2:13**).
 - 3. Don't ever think that ignorance is the only reason people are lost (**Romans 1:18-32**).
