That We May Lead A Quiet And Peaceable Life...

I. Introduction:

A. If you do not understand a point in it's proper context you will come to false conclusions (**John 21:20-23**).

1. Thus, we have to handle aright the word of God (II Timothy 2:14-18).

2. Without twisting the truth (**II Peter 3:14-18**).

B. Additionally, if you want to prove something you already believe it is easy to twist Scriptures to justify false conclusions (**Matthew 12:10-12**; cf. **Hosea 6:4-6**).

1. You go to the Scriptures to find the truth (**John 5:39**), not prove your own conclusions (**Romans 10:1-3**).

2. People will seek to justify themselves against the truth (Luke 10:25-29).

3. Where does self-justification get anyone (Luke 16:15)?

II. Body: Let's Honestly Study An Oft Misunderstood Context (I Timothy 1:18-2:4).

A. Timothy was trusted to teach, war against that which caused people's faith to be shipwreck (**I Timothy 1:3-7**).

1. Timothy's "job", in brief (I Timothy 4:1-16, I Timothy 6:11-21, and II Timothy 4:1-5).

2. As was prophesied (**I Timothy 4:14**).

B. In Timothy's work, he was instructed to have supplications, prayers, intercession, giving of thanks for all men; including kings and those in authority (**Romans 10:1**).

1. Think of this from an evangelists perspective because that is who was written to here (i.e. **Acts 6:8-7:60**).

2. What was Paul's prayer (Romans 10:1)?

3. Now, what did/do all men (**Luke 6:22**, **Luke 21:17**, **John 17:14**, etc.) and kings in authority do to those who preach(ed) the truth (**Matthew 10:16-18**, **Acts 12:1-2**, etc.)?

4. Thus, the only reasonable conclusion that fits the context and the life of an evangelist: **Matthew 5:38-48**!

C. Praying for others so that "we" may lead a quiet [tranquil] and peaceable [still; undisturbed] life in all godliness and honesty (**II Peter 3:14**).

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1. Does this mean carnal peace (John 16:33, Acts 14:22, II Timothy 3:12, and I Peter 4:12-16)?

2. How do we arrive at peace (**Romans 8:6**)?

3. Would, in any way, the world be able to give us peace and quiet (John 14:27; cf. I Corinthians 14:33 and Colossians 3:15)?

4. Living godly and honestly (Acts 24:16 and Romans 12:17-18).

D. It is good to pray for all men because God wants all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth (**II Peter 3:9-11**).

1. We can/should stand before God and plead for Him to be longsuffering with humanity that they might have the same opportunity to be saved as we have had (**Jeremiah 18:20**).

2. Remember, God waited before destroying the earth once before (**I Peter 3:20**).

3. Think about what Jesus did (**Luke 23:33-34**) and what that lead to (**Acts 2:14-41**).

3. If you continued reading through the context this sermon is based upon, you find this context is about teaching, salvation, and faithful living – NOT about carnal peace on earth (**I Timothy 2:5-15**).

III. Conclusion: The quiet and peaceable life (Philippians 4:4-9).
