The Integrity Of The Upright Shall Guide Them

I. Introduction:

- A. We know the place the word of God has in our lives (Psalms 19:7-11, Psalms 119:9-11, Luke 4:1-4, John 6:63, Il Timothy 3:15-17, Il Peter 1:3-4, etc.).
 - 1. What happens though when we cannot think of book, chapter, and verse when in a situation?
 - 2. What do we do when facing situations involving authorized liberties and we have to make wise choices (i.e. I Corinthians 10:23-33)?
 - 3. Being careful, for a good conscience in ignorance can result in sin (Acts 23:1 and Acts 24:16; cf. Galatians 1:13).
- B. Key terms for this lesson:
 - 1. Integrity: "Innocence" (Strong's # 8538)
 - 2. Upright: "...straight, upright, correct, right" (Strong's # 3477).
 - 3. Guide: "To transport (into exile, or as colonists): bestow, bring, govern, guide, lead (forth), put, straiten..." (Strong's # 5148).
- II. Body: There Are Times When You Lean Upon Your Integrity (**Proverbs 11:3-6**).
 - A. Righteousness can keep you in the right ways (**Proverbs 13:6**).
 - 1. Not our own righteousness (**Proverbs 30:12, Luke 18:9-14**, and **Romans 10:1-3**).
 - 2. Rather, the righteousness we have of God (Philippians 3:7-9).
 - 3. The righteousness that defines us as saints (**Ephesians 4:24-5:11**, **II Timothy 2:22**, and **I John 2:29**).
 - 4. This works, because being righteous means not sinning (I **Corinthians** 15:34 and I **John** 3:7-10).
 - B. Think about innocence, purity (**Titus 1:15**).
 - 1. A good conscience is connected to a pure heart (I Timothy 1:5).
 - 2. Being pure brings about right works (Proverbs 21:8).
 - 3. Always remembering our purity is not of us (Titus 2:11-14).
 - C. Thinking about being upright (Proverbs 16:17 and Proverbs 21:29).
 - 1. The upright find strength from the way of the Lord (**Proverbs 10:29**).
 - 2. The result of being upright is great (**Proverbs 28:10**; **28:18**).
 - D. Some further brief thoughts:
 - 1. You are in a situation wherein things don't "feel right". You don't think of **Romans 14:23**, but should know that if it doesn't "feel right", don't act.
 - 2. Being righteous, innocent, and upright will help you in times wherein "peer pressure" arises even if you're not thinking of **I Corinthians 15:33**.
 - 3. Even the untaught "knew" some right from wrong (Romans 2:12-15).
