## **Then Understood They**

## I. Introduction:

- A. There are warnings throughout the Scriptures about forgetting our Lord, His word, etc. (**Deuteronomy 4:22-23**, **Proverbs 3:1**, and **James 1:21-25**).
  - 1. Some forgetfulness comes about because of changes in circumstances and spiritual negligence (**Deuteronomy 6:4-12**).
  - 2. Some forget through bad influence (Jeremiah 23:25-27).
  - 3. There are those who do not want to retain God in their knowledge and that leads to their inability to understand (**Romans 1:28-32**).
- B. Throughout this lesson, be mindful that understanding and remembering often tie together (**Proverbs 4:5**).
  - 1. Learning requires one to remember things (II Peter 3:1-2).
  - 2. Spiritual growth is a step up system rather than learn this while forgetting that (**II Peter 1:1-13**).
- II. Body: Consider What Contributed To Their Lack Of Understanding (**Matthew 16:1-12**).
  - A. The disciples had previously witnessed the feeding of the of the five thousand plus (**Matthew 14:13-21**) and of the four thousand plus (**Matthew 15:32-39**).
    - 1. They lacked recollection that kept them from understanding. That continued to be a problem going forward (Luke 24:1-8; cf. Matthew 20:18-19 and Luke 9:22).
    - 2. Furthermore, had they recalled their own history, would they really have thought Jesus was concerned about a lack of bread (**Exodus 16:1-17**)?
    - 3. Had they recalled what Jesus originally taught them when He sent them out to teach, would they have thought this was about not having bread (Matthew 10:5-15)?
  - B. Remembering is vital (Psalms 78:1-8, Psalms 119:90-93, and I Corinthians 15:1-2).
    - 1. Teaching includes bringing to remembrance (Acts 20:28-31, I Timothy 4:6, and Jude 1:5; 1:17-19).
    - 2. We need to remember to be able to tie things together (Luke 24:44).
    - 3. Remembering aids in understanding and focus (II Timothy 2:1-13).
    - 4. We need to remember to worship God correctly (**Psalms 97:12**, **Isaiah 25:1**, and **I Corinthians 11:23-26**).
    - 5. Even repentance from sin includes remembrance (**Revelation 2:1-7** and **Revelation 3:1-6**).
  - C. Consider some applications...
    - 1. If you <u>remember</u> that Old Testament prophecies were fulfilled before the New Testament was in full effect (**Matthew 5:17-19**); that keeps you from <u>misunderstanding</u> Old Testament prophecies (i.e. you'll know verses like

- **Isaiah 13:9** CANNOT be about the end of the world; in addition to context; **Isaiah 13:1**).
- 2. If you <u>remember</u> that only the Father knows when Christ will return and the world will end, you'll <u>understand</u> that no Scripture tells when Jesus is coming (**Mark 13:31-32**).
- 3. If you <u>remember</u> Jesus will never be on earth again (I Thessalonians 4:13-18 and Hebrews 6:20; 7:22-24; 8:1-4), you'll <u>understand</u> that any doctrine putting Christ back on earth is false.
- 4. If you <u>remember</u> the world is evil (**I John 5:19**), you'll <u>understand</u> how cautious you need to be (**Proverbs 14:15** and **Ephesians 5:15-17**).
- 5. If you <u>remember</u> that you must prove [test; discern] what is acceptable unto the Lord (**Ephesians 5:10**); you'll <u>understand</u> that your way is not the right way (**Proverbs 16:25**, **Proverbs 21:2**, and **I Corinthians 4:6**).
- 6. If you <u>understand</u> that sin is found in the multitude of words (**Proverbs 10:19**), you'll <u>remember</u> not to talk too much (**Proverbs 17:27-28** and **James 1:19**).
- III. Conclusion: Let's be the people of understanding that we ought to be (**Proverbs** 16:22 and **Proverbs** 19:8).
