"Thou Art Beside Thyself"

I. Introduction:

- A. Being a disciple our Lord means we are different, separate from the world (Acts 2:40-41, Galatians 1:4, and Titus 2:11-14).
 - 1. As in Jesus prayer concerning the disciples, being in the world but not of the world (**John 17:14-17**).
 - 2. Think about what it means to come out from among them and be separate (**II Corinthians 6:14-7:1**).
- B. Taking a stand for the Lord will cause people to look at you in unfavorable ways (i.e. **Acts 4:1-13**).
 - 1. You're considered strange (I Peter 4:1-5).
 - 2. Even Jesus was thought to have been "beside Himself" [out of wits; insane] and even having Beelzebub (**Mark 3:13-23**).
- II. Body: Are You Willing To Be Identified as Crazy (Acts 26:1-32)? *See vs. 24
 - A. Consider the bold man Elijah (I Kings 18:1-46).
 - 1. It is impressive what he did in standing against the prophets, but think of the risk of standing against a king (**Proverbs 16:14**; **19:12**).
 - 2. How strong was he when he felt alone (I Kings 19:1-4; 19:9-18)?
 - B. Consider the <u>bold</u> man Peter (**Acts 4:18-21**; **4:31** and a Scripture referenced earlier: **Acts 4:13**).
 - 1. He would draw a sword to defend Jesus (John 18:10-11).
 - 2. He boldly told the Lord He would never be offended because of Jesus (Matthew 26:31-35).
 - 3. However, when Jesus was no longer by his side... Matthew 26:69-75
 - C. Think about the significance of being one who doesn't conform (**Romans 12:1-2**).
 - 1. Not following the crowd (Exodus 23:2).
 - 2. The ability to refrain (**Proverbs 1:10-19**).
 - 3. The willingness to sit alone (Psalms 26:4-5 and Jeremiah 15:17).
 - 4. How strong (**Ephesians 6:10**) do you have to be to truly say and mean "though none go with me, I still will follow Jesus" (**Matthew 26:55-56**)?
- III. Conclusion: The real crazies, are those whom have not/do not, obey the Gospel of our Lord (II Thessalonians 1:7-9 and I Peter 4:17-19).
