## We Are Not Inclined To Do Evil

## I. Introduction:

- A. Some take Scriptures such as **Isaiah 53:6** and **Ecclesiastes 7:20** and teach that man has a sinful nature.
  - 1. What is missed is that there are those times in history when it was very hard to find a faithful man (i.e. **Genesis 6:6-9**).
  - 2. Statements such as **Romans 3:23** have to be considered as exaggerated statements because <u>ALL</u> had not sinned (**I Peter 2:21-22**).
  - 3. Come back to the perfect man Noah, who was saved, what was said in that same context concerning "all flesh" (**Genesis 6:12-13**).
- B. Sin is a choice (**James 4:17** and **I John 3:1-10**).
  - 1. The king of Tyrus was told he was perfect, until... (**Ezekiel 28:12**; **28:15**).
  - 2. Under both the old and new covenants, we see sin is a choice that people make (**Ezekiel 18:4-9 and Romans 6:16**).
- II. Body: God Hath Made Man Upright, But... (Ecclesiastes 7:29).
  - A. The Scriptures teach that man corrupts himself (Exodus 32:7, Judges 2:19, Hosea 9:8-9, and Jude 1:10).
    - 1. Man has the power to cease being corrupt (Ephesians 4:22).
    - 2. We can escape corruption (II Peter 1:4).
  - B. Freewill is an undeniable truth (**Revelation 22:14-17**).
    - 1. The "Old Testament" shows freewill (Exodus 15:26, Deuteronomy 30:15-20, Joshua 24:20-24, Proverbs 1:29, and Ezekiel 18:20).
    - 2. The "New Testament" shows freewill (Luke 11:28, Acts 17:4-5, Philippians 2:12, and James 1:13-16).
    - 3. The Judgment of God on humanity is rooted in this truth (**John 5:28-29**).
  - C. If a person chooses to sin, that person can repent (Acts 3:19).
    - 1. This can be seen in the "Old Testament" (II Chronicles 7:14, Proverbs 28:13, Isaiah 55:6-7, Jeremiah 26:13, Ezekiel 14:6, Ezekiel 18:30, Ezekiel 33:14-16, and Jonah 3:1-10).
    - 2. This can be seen in the "New Testament" (Matthew 3:1-2, Matthew 4:17, Matthew 12:41, Mark 6:12, Luke 3:7-8, Luke 13:1-5, Luke 24:47, Acts 2:38, Acts 17:30, II Peter 3:9, and Revelation 2:5).
    - 3. Those whom have chosen to sin can also choose to cease from sin (John 8:1-11, II Timothy 2:19, and I Peter 4:1-5).
