## Which In Times Past Were Not A People

I. Introduction:

A. Prior to the initial coming of Christ into this world, God had a people that were special to Him (**Exodus 4:22-23**).

1. If they obeyed God they would continue to be special to Him (**Exodus 19:5-6** and **Deuteronomy 7:6-7**).

2. Israel had the promises, covenants, etc. (Romans 9:4).

B. The thing is, behind those promises to Israel was a greater promise (Galatians 3:8-9). \*Note, how could "the Scripture" foresee? Remember that when the word is personified, you are talking about Jesus (John 1:1-14).

1. The message, of greater promises, was echoed through the words of old (Acts 15:11-19; cf. Isaiah 49:1-7 and Isaiah 66:18-21).

2. Jesus, as Simeon said, was a light to lighten the Gentiles (**Luke 2:25-32**).

## II. Body: I Peter 2:1-10

A. Regarding being a chosen [elect] generation [kin; offspring; nation]; Follow this thought... Consider what was said to the Gentiles in Ephesus (**Ephesians 2:1-17**).

1. Now, when did God decide that Gentiles [non-Jews] would be chosen (**Ephesians 1:3-4**)?

2. So, we Gentiles, should not at all feel that we are God's second choice. What Christ did for all people (**I John 4:14**) was planed before the world was created (**I Peter 1:18-20**).

B. Think about being a <u>royal priesthood</u> to God (**Revelation 1:5-6**).

1. We offer "spiritual sacrifices" (Hebrews 13:15-16).

2. Our bodies (Romans 12:1).

3. When the saints in Philippi supported Paul, such was referred to as: "a sacrifice acceptable, wellpleasing to God" (Philippians 4:11-18).

C. A peculiar [beyond usual, special, possession] people (Titus 2:13-14).

1. That once applied to Israel (Psalms 135:4).

2. Jesus paid significantly so that all could be included (Mark 10:45).

D. Jesus taught that he that is least in the kingdom of God is greater than John the Baptist (**Luke 7:28**).

1. Who you are (John 1:12-13 and I John 3:1-3).

- 2. Whose you are (I Corinthians 3:20-23).
- 3. What you are (Philippians 2:14-16) and are a part of (Revelation 1:9).

III. Conclusion: Knowing you are the people of God, live up to it to the praise and glory of God (**Ephesians 1:6** and **Philippians 1:10-11**)!
