I. Introduction: Katrina and I were running recently. As we approached a slight uphill grade, she expressed how much harder that part of the run was. Yet, it is one of the most beneficial parts of that running route as a challenge to one's endurance.

A. It is not my intention to infer or state that being a faithful Christian is too difficult. It is not (**Matthew 11:28-30** and **I John 5:2-3**).

1. Yes, there are things we face because we are Christians that others do not (John 15:20 and II Timothy 3:12).

2. Yet, much of what we face is common to all (I Corinthians 10:13).

3. Even the worse saints have faced was still just for a brief period of time (I Peter 1:6-7 and Revelation 2:10).

B. Though what we face is light, especially compared to saints of old, we don't want to be softies (**Proverbs 24:10**).

1. We have to be able to endure some difficult things in life (James 1:12 and I Peter 4:12-13).

2. That pattern has been in place since long ago (Hebrews 6:13-15).

II. Body: The Illustration Of Running A Race (I Corinthians 9:24-27).

A. Don't fear the uphill, the difficult part of the run because that will build up your endurance (**Romans 5:3-4** and **James 1:2-3**).

2. Jesus told His disciples to endure till the end to be saved (**Matthew 10:22**).

3. We don't want to quit running before the end of this race (Hebrews 3:6).

B. Looking to Jesus in that run (Hebrews 12:1-3).

1. Making sure no one is hindering us (Galatians 5:7).

2. Drawing your strength from knowing that Jesus did it and you can too (**Philippians 4:13** and **I Peter 2:21-24**).

3. Jesus won the fight, the race, etc. He then gives unto us the pattern of victory (I Corinthians 15:20-23; 15:54-57).

4. What did Paul say at the end of his life (**II Timothy 4:6-8**).

C. Don't get weary in well-doing (Galatians 6:9).

- 1. Our labor is not and will not be in vain (Hebrews 6:10-12).
- 2. Have a finisher's mentality (John 4:30-34 and Acts 20:22-24).

III. Conclusion: Once converted to Christ we arrive at the figurative Mount Zion (**Hebrews 12:22-23**). Yet, we have higher heights to reach (**Philippians 3:7-15**).
