Worship God

I. Introduction:

- A. We do not want to fall into the false conclusion that we assemble together only for the purpose of worshipping God (Acts 14:26-27).
 - 1. Having said that, we also do not want to set God aside in our assembly (**Psalms 107:21-22** and **Hebrews 13:15**).
 - 2. God has always desired to be upheld and glorified among His people (Leviticus 10:3, Romans 15:6, and I Peter 4:11).
- B. We don't want to start thinking about our coming together as only for ourselves and end up lacking in our reverence toward God (**Psalms 89:7**).
 - 1. We are to approach God with respect, awe, honor, bashfulness, etc. (Psalms 4:3-5, Psalms 68:3-4, Psalms 96:7-9, Psalms 138:6, Isaiah 66:1-2, and Luke 18:9-14).
 - 2. Think about what we can read about regarding Israel (Malachi 1:6-14).

II. Body: Revelation 19:6-10 and Revelation 22:6-9

- A. The term translated "worship" [προσκυνέω] meaning: "To fawn or crouch to, i.e. (literally or figuratively) prostrate oneself in homage (do reverence to, adore):

 worship..." (Strong's # 4352).
 - 1. Jesus said, worship God (Matthew 4:9-10 and John 4:20-24).
 - 2. Peter said, not man (Acts 10:25-26).
 - 3. God is due our worshipping of Him (**Psalms 29:1-2**).
- B. Adoring Him as though there is none other (**Deuteronomy 4:39**).
 - 1. When we worship God, we are worshipping our Creator (**Psalms 148:5**, **Nehemiah 9:6**, **Revelation 4:11**, and **Revelation 14:6-7**).
 - 2. Just thinking about who we could even liken to Him (Isaiah 40:18-26).
- C. Making sure we're not just mindful of pleasing one another, but most of all that our assembling together and worship is pleasing to God (**Colossians 1:10**).
 - 1. We cannot fall into the errors we read about in the past (**Matthew 15:1-14**).
 - 2. Nor do we want to get into worship designed by our own will (**Colossians 1:18-23**; cf. **Deuteronomy 12:8**).
- III. Conclusion: "Exalt ye the LORD our God, and worship at his footstool; for he is holy" (Psalms 99:5).
