You Can Have More Than One Emotion At A Time

I. Introduction:

- A. God's people should be happy (**Psalms 144:15** and **Proverbs 16:20**) and able to rejoice (**Philippians 4:4** and **I Thessalonians 5:16**).
 - 1. Even when the world around us is on fire, we have plenty to be happy about (**Ephesians 1:3**).
 - 2. We are even supposed to have joy in times of adversity (James 1:2-3).
- B. But wait, the Bible also says the opposite (Ecclesiastes 7:1-3).
 - 1. Weep now, woe to... (Luke 6:21; 6:25).
 - 2. A faithful Apostle had a continual sorrow (**Romans 9:1-3**) and he serves as a pattern for others to follow (**I Corinthians 4:16**; **11:1**).
 - 3. So, what is what?
- II. Body: Think About Sorrow AND Rejoicing (II Corinthians 6:10).
 - A. Spiritually minded people can greatly rejoice AND have great heaviness at the same time when properly focused (I Peter 1:3-9).
 - 1. Paul suffered having many tears and yet joy as well because of his focus (Acts 20:17-24).
 - 2. Don't think that was easy for him (II Corinthians 1:8; 7:5).
 - B. The greatest of all examples suffered much (I Peter 2:21-24).
 - 1. The Scriptures say Jesus had strong crying (**Hebrews 5:5-7**).
 - 2. Jesus had a time wherein He was "exceedingly sorrowful" (Mark 14:32-42).
 - 3. His soul was troubled (John 12:27).
 - 4. Yet, He was "glad" [full of cheer] (**John 11:15**) and anointed with the oil of gladness [exceeding joy] above others (**Hebrews 1:8-9**).
 - C. Sometimes there has to be a focus on one emotion over another based on circumstances (i.e. **James 4:6-10** or **I Peter 4:12-14**). But, that doesn't mean we should just be happy or sad all the time.
 - 1. Remember that God made us in His likeness (Genesis 1:26-27; 5:1).
 - 2. God has multiple emotions (**Psalms 78:40**, **Zephaniah 3:17**, **Luke 19:41-44**, etc., etc.).
 - 3. Yet, He is not defined by one thing He feels (**Psalms 30:4-5**).
 - 4. He is our example (Ephesians 5:1).
- III. Conclusion: You don't have to be just happy or sad, etc. Know there are times for feelings to come about (**Ecclesiastes 3:1-8**)!
